On a gorgeous Saturday morning in July, three "adventure riders" (Ha!) rode off into the unknown. It was an off-road (off pavement that is) trip that had been talked about for 2 years. So with the cooperation of great weather, the aid of a Forest Service map, water \& extra tools (just in case) and an adventure spirit we headed out. Now don't laugh, cause it wasn't a gnarly old single track or even a gnarly old dual track.

It was the Tribal/Forest Service road of approximately 40 miles between Arlee, Mt. and Placid Lake, Mt. Still only one of us had been on this road, that being 25 years ago. So adventure it was, but I would have to say it wasn't anything too serious. It was just plain fun. In fact I would recommend this as a great road for someone wanting to start off ' $G$ Sing', with the added benefit of beautiful scenery along the way.

The three riders were Chuck Reaves F65oGS, Mike Reaves KLR650, and instigator \& photographer Terry Kay F65o Dakar.

The road was very good especially on the Tribal side. It was also fairly well marked once we figured out the scale of the map, the miles we were traveling along those map squares and where the ist turn came in. FYI, the Forest Service map did not designate a number for the Tribal road. FYI, it's Prooo. Otherwise it was a road well marked. Not only was it well maintained but the up and over the divide, if you can call it that, was very moderate.

Upper and Lower Jocko Lakes along the way were the highlights of the trip. We stopped often to enjoy the scenery, take pictures \& have some water as it was one of those hot, though not sweltering July days; low 90's rather than low ioo's. Once through the Tribal part of the ride the road became FS Road 349. This road was also well maintained but the scenery surrounding us changed dramatically as we began the downhill from Jocko Lakes.

We entered the burn area from the big fire of 2007. Amazing how much was burned! Déjà vu to me as I happened to be camping @ Placid Lake the night that fire started; and next morning, us campers were evacuated because of the fire. The flames were spectacular to see then. You realized then as now how many, not just acres, but miles were burned. There were approximately

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ro-15 miles of burned forest going from Jocko Lakes to just a few miles west of Placid Lake. All burned to a crisp, now covered in beautiful wildflowers and allowing ginormous panoramas of the Swan Range to the east.
This summer day, as back in the year of the burn, the Placid Lake campground sign showed "Campground Full" as we motored by, near the end of the dirt portion of the trip.

Again I'd say for anyone new to GS riding this is a great 'starter road'. Total time was 6 hours. Time on the dirt part of the trek was $2^{1 / 2}$ hours; again taking our time.

Hunger hit the adventure riders, so for lunch we detoured to Seeley Lake for Bayburgers on the shore directly behind Lindey's Restaurant. Yum! With lots of adventure under our belts, lots of pictures taken and memories made we headed back to Missoula, encountering lots of adventure with recreationists on Hiway 200 on the way home. It's all an adventure, it's all good.


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
