"I started out on July 9 (Thursday) heading for the BMW Lunatic Fringe Rally at the Beaupre Community Hall west of Cochrane (a little north of her home in Calgary, Alberta) ... I always marvel at the many miles we travel and there everyone is and we are together for awhile ... We had a great time over the weekend but only 40 attended...I left there Sunday morning headed up the Icefields Parkway. I stopped at the Saskatchewan River Crossing and had a \$20.00 hamburger???...I got a room in Grand Prairie and stopped in the next morning to visit Fleet Brake. Met some of the ones I had only spoken to in the past. I left there and headed for Dawson Creek. Stopped at a tourist information (center) and then the Mile 0 campground where the rally was to

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be. I discovered the Mile 1 Café in the Pioneer Village and ate lunch there and met the great people trying to make a go of it. Because of the visiting I did not get far the first day. Charlie Lake just north of Fort St. John was my first campsite. The next day I went to Liard Hot Springs. I camped there and took a dip the lovely pool. The next day I went through Watson Lake, Yukon and headed south on the Cassiar Highway going to Stewart but I ended up staying in a camp at Meziadin Junction, 68 km's shy of Stewart, but I was looking into the sun and it was getting late. Lots of bears in the area so I did not want to camp. I was there (at Hyder, Alaska) at 9am and could not get Hyderized till 11am... Headed out to Prince George and Dawson Creek. I arrived Friday for the rally and it did not start until Monday but much to my delight a lot of people arrived early as well. We had 83 at the rally. We took a ride to Tumbler Ridge on Monday and saw a moose and her twins down in the ditch. I packed up and left early Tuesday morning and after riding through a hailstorm by Didsbury, arrived home and slept in my own bed, getting up early the next day and riding all the way to the BMW National Rally in Billings, Montana. Got in late and was greeted by no less than 10 friends before I had my tent up. This was a great rally also with 5,872 in attendance. Lots of seminars, lots of lines for food, etc. Not all bad as I met many great people in line. Then after all was done I headed home via Cody, Wyoming and the Chief Joseph Highway. Whoops, that's the wrong way. Wanted to do the Chief Joseph and was sooo close. I also wanted to go to the Irma Hotel for dinner. The food was delicious and what a neat old place. Irma was one of Buffalo Bill Cody's daughters. On the way home I took a road off I 90...278 which comes out in Helena. On the corner I went

into Wheat Montana and met the loveliest couple who own a ranch in Harrison, Montana and they want me to come and visit. Not only that but that road runs up the valley between 2 mountain ranges and there are wheat fields as far as the eye can see. On arriving home I decide that because nothing was planned we would ride to Drumheller, Wayne and finish up in Strathmore...
