

There have been stories, rumors and confusion regarding the driveshaft issues on BMW shaft drive motor-cycles. As I have a couple of these bikes I have been doing some research after first learning of a service bulletin earlier in March.

I have obtained a copy of the service bulletin and will attempt to paraphrase the bulletin here for your information. Much of what I have written here is directly from the bulletin, thus some odd phrasing probably translated from German to English.

Basically the Service Information Bulletin pertains to R1200 and R1250, a.k.a. K5x models, which are **liquid cooled** R motorcycles, 2023 and older. The bulletin is known as SI 33 04 23 and was first published Dec 12, 2023. This includes R1200 and R1250 GS, GSA, RT, R and RS designations.

SITUATION

Since October 2023, a new maintenance schedule is valid for all K5x models. For the first time a new maintenance schedule is valid for all K5x models. For the first time, maintenance positions for the cardan shaft (driveshaft) are included.

NOTICE:

The new maintenance schedule is not limited to vehicles affected by the SI 33 02 22 service action Swingarm Drain retrofit and Driveshaft Check, but is valid for K5x models including retroactively. In case of retroactive validity (model year 2023 and older), affected customers will be informed about the change. This will be in the form of direct-to-customer letter with a description of the new maintenance schedule, specific owner's manual insert and consumer warranty book insert. I have not received any notification as of yet.

For vehicles affected by SI 33 02 22 (SERVICE ACTION: Swingarm Drain Retrofit and Driveshaft Check), this service action must be performed first. All conditions described in this bulletin apply after the open Service Action has been completed.

No additional information is required for K5x models year 2024 and onwards. Those models have the new maintenance schedule in their owner's manual.

This Service Information is published for all K5x vehicles with model 2023 and older.

- Check the cardan shaft with ISTA-led test method and grease the splines every 12,000 miles (20,000km). It is my understanding that if the cardan shaft fails the test BMW Motorad will replace it at no cost to the owner.
- Replacement of the cardan shaft (driveshaft) every 36,000 miles (60,000km) (cardan shaft driveshaft) mileage has to be checked).
- If the cardan shaft has already been replaced before 36,000 miles, like say 20,000 miles, it will be replaced again when the replacement driveshaft has been in use for 36,000 miles or in this example 56,000 miles.

Note: The cost for replacement can be claimed by the dealerships on the defect code 9033009900.

The replacement check and regrease of the cardan shaft (driveshaft) is covered by warranty and is offered to all customers that own a K5x motorcycle year 2023 and older and unlimited miles or general service to the customer.

Note: If the cardan (driveshaft) check (test result in ISTA) shows that the shaft needs to be replaced, the replacement can be claimed using defect code 9033009700 (NOT on SIB 33 02 22 SERVICE ACTION: Swingarm Drain retrofit and Driveshaft Check).

From what I hear, and somewhat apparent by the bulletin, 2024 and onward models will not be covered by a BMW warranty. Maintenance to learn about and consider in the purchase of a 2024 and onward model.

If the cardan (driveshaft) check (test result in ISTA) shows that the shaft needs to be replaced, the replacement can be claimed using defect code 9033009700.

My 2016 RT has 23,000 miles on it and my 2018 RT has 12,000 miles on it so I will be working to get them both in for cardan shaft testing and possible replacement. I know of one buddy here in CA who has already had a cardan shaft replacement on his 2019 R1250RT at a bit over 36,000 miles.

Ride safe, keep the rubber side down.

Bob Balderston - Motorcycle Rider



After graduating high school in Utah in 1963, I moved to Great Falls, Montana to live and enrolled in the College of Great Falls. After receiving a military draft notice in the fall of 1965, I joined the Army Reserve. I reported to a special basic army training site at Camp Roberts, California. After Camp Roberts, I was in a holding company for several months awaiting orders for OJT (On The Job) training but then the Army sent me back home to await further orders. I enrolled in the University of Utah but the enrollment was short-lived as the Army sent me orders to go to Fort Ord, California for basic training again. After completing Basic Training - round two - I was once again put in a holding company for a couple of months awaiting OJT assignment and then sent to Fort Campbell, Kentucky to join with the 101st Airborne Division, 3rd Army. Fellow soldiers were going to and coming back from the Vietnam War. I was lucky as I returned to Utah and enrolled in college once again.

The fall of 1967 while attending math class, I looked out the window and saw a couple of guys riding motorcycles that were trying to climb up the mountain that had the big "U" on it. I turned and asked the guy sitting next to me what he thought they were doing. He said that they were hill climbing. I responded that it looked kind of fun. He asked if I would like to try it as he had a motorcycle parked outside. I said, "sure" and soon I was sitting behind him on his 650 Rickman Triumph. As we started up the mountain, we hit a big bump and I was pitched off the bike. However, he continued on to the "U". He stopped on his way back down and asked how I was doing. I said, "Fine just a few bruises and a little bleeding from scrapes, although I did tear my pants and shirt." I was bitten by the motorcycle bug and I purchased that Rickman Triumph. I became good friends with Jack who took me riding with him in the desert and taught me a lot about riding. We entered desert races, hill climbs, trail riding and just rode a lot. While attending college, I worked several part time jobs, loading trucks, grocery store, airport janitor, still riding and racing whenever I could.





As time progressed, I acquired a full time job and moved into an old house that had been converted into three apartments. It was painted a hideous pink. I dubbed it "the Pink Palace" and it wasn't long before I was sharing space with the Rickman, BSA-B50, and new 1970 Husqvarna 400. I was riding and racing whenever I had time; desert racing /riding, mountain trail riding. In 1970 I was introduced to motocross when a friend and I traveled to Boise Idaho to watch an InterAm event which included several top European riders competing against top American riders. After watching this event, I was hooked into becoming a motocross racer. I replaced the Rickman and BSA with a new 1970 Maico 250, put

my number 266 on the plates with electrical tape and entered my first motocross race finishing second (a Greeves rider passed me in the last corner at the finish).

In 1972 I got married and started working for a manufacturer's representative company that sold equipment for water and wastewater projects throughout the intermountain area and my wife, Sharon, taught High School English. In 1974 we had the opportunity to move back to Montana working for the representative company. My riding and racing were put on slow mode for a while as we had a baby daughter and had moved into a "fixer-upper" home. When 1977 rolled around and I decided to start my own company in the water/waste representative market. This venture became very challenging. However, my wife proved to be a very astute business person as she guided us into this new adventure. By this time we had a daughter and a son so I raced whenever time would allow. In 1980 I went into partnership with a friend and we purchased the Boondocker shop in Great Falls which was a dealer for Husqvarna, Maico and Ossa mo-



torcycles. This venture did not last very long as it was very demanding time wise and I eventually had to sell it.

In 1983 one of our Manufactures (AO Smith Aquastore) decided to offer their representatives the opportunity to construct the tanks that we were selling so I started a new construction company that sold and erected water tanks. That same year we were also blessed with our third child and second daughter. I traveled a lot with both businesses and occasionally I would be compelled to buy a new motorcycle such as a 1995 ATK 250, 1996 KTM 360, 2002 KTM 520 which I have never ridden but still have.



My venture into vintage motocross started in 1990 when I watched a couple of my friends race at Steamboat Springs, Colorado in an AHR-MA event (American Historical Racing Motorcycle Association). The racing tracks were suitable for old bikes, 1974 and earlier and they had classes for older riders and others. This got my attention and I started competing whenever I could. I also started collecting old bikes as I traveled around, planning to restore some of them. Collecting them proved to be easier than restoring them; hence I have a backlog at this time. I still go to a couple of vintage events with friends as you meet really nice people there and have a good time with fellow enthusiasts .

I never did any road riding on

a motorcycle but in 1996 I bought my first road bike, a 1975 BMW R75/6 from a Harley Shop. I was told the mechanic had just completely gone through everything on the bike but this did not prove to be true. The more I rode it the worse it ran. I eventually replaced just about everything starting with the crank, pistons and working my way down to nuts and bolts. I still have the bike and I do ride it occasionally. Currently I have six BMW's, two K 100's, 1977 R100S, 1975 R75/6, 1975 R90S, and 1984 R100S all which need a little love and attention.



2024 Montana BMW Riders Annual Mileage Contest - Larry Banister

Ladies and gentlemen,

As I'm writing this for the April newsletter, my wife and I are still in Arizona. That may be relevant to you for a couple of reasons: 1) The start date of our annual mileage contest is April 1st, 2024 and I will not be home in Montana at that time; 2) I have yet to receive my MOA magazine which should have the beginning mileage contest forms from MOA in it (BMW MOA mileage forms are on line The Mileage Contest - BMW Motorcycle Owners of America (bmwmoa.org); and 3) My spread sheet for the mileage contest is safely stored on my home desktop, thus my ability to update it will have to wait for me to get home.

What all of this means is that this is the official notice of the beginning date of our Montana BMW Riders Mileage contest. Our rules for participating are pretty simple:

- 1. You must be a paid up member of the Montana BMW Riders to participate;
- 2. Any brand of motorcycle is eligible for the contest (not exclusively BMW's which is a national mileage contest requirement);
- 3. You may enter any number of owned motorcycles into the mileage contest;
- 4. If you buy a new motorcycle during the contest and originally signed up, you can enter the new ride when you get it;
- 5. All entries must include the make, model, year and beginning mileage of each motorcycle you're planning on entering;
- 6. All entries must be in writing. They can be mailed to me at 102 Ironwood Place, Missoula, Montana 59803, they can be emailed to me at: beemermt@msn.com or texted to me at 406-274-3887;
- 7. To count for this year's contest, all entries must be submitted on or before **4/30/24**. (Given my location in Arizona, and the fact that some email entries and/or snail mail entries may get lost in the dark hole of transit, please keep a copy of your entry.

When I get home to Montana, I'll update this years mileage contest spread sheet with the names and motorcycle information as per above, and will get a copy of that spread sheet for membership-wide distributions. If, when you get a copy of that spread sheet and it does not include your name and bike info, you need to contact me by re-submitting your initial entry info as what has happened is that I didn't get it for some reason.

Reasons for entering: 1) It's the BMW trademark to ride our bikes, not just look at them; entering this contest will help you keep track of your mileage; 2) there's CASH involved...the overall winner gets a check from the club for \$75, the one who's overall mileage is closest to the calculated "average mileage" of all participants will receive a check for \$75; 3) after excluding the overall winner and average mileage winner from the total participants, the remaining names are placed into a hat, one is drawn, and this individual becomes the "at large" winner and the recipient of a check for \$50. 3) The overall winner gets his/her name engraved on the club mileage plaque which is kept on display at Big Sky BMW in Missoula. (What more could you ask for!!!??)

As our group is know for adventures and as you can see from the club newsletter, there are a great many of club excursions planned, this should be a great year to get out and ride. Why not let me keep track of our mileage for you (you could win cash for riding!).

Looking forward to hearing from you beginning in April. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me as per instruction #5.







The area around the Dragoon Mountains was inhabited by the **Apache people** as early as the 15th century.

Ancient pictographs and **matate** (grinding stone) sites dating back to **AD 1200** have been discovered, attributed to the **Mogollon people**.

The legendary Apache warrior **Cochise** and his forces clashed with Confederate soldiers in the **First Battle of Dragoon Springs** here. Although he was initially defeated in the **Second Battle of Dragoon Springs**, Cochise's legacy endures in this rugged terrain.

Cochise Stronghold Memorial Park lies near **Mount Glenn** on the eastern slope of the range, serving as a testament to these historical events.

Hi Dick,


Here is a trip I took yesterday.


