# CAFE TO CAFE RULES

<u>General</u>: The Montana BMW Riders' Café to Café contest is intended to increase the girth of our members and to get them to put more miles on their motorcycles. The concept is simple, get on your motorcycle, link up with some friends, ride to one of the listed cafes and consume something. Repeat as needed. The winner is the person who gets to the most cafes. Ties will be resolved according to the rules listed below. The top three riders will receive a prize. To receive credit for visiting a café the rider must submit a photograph via email as described in the rules below.

<u>Big Sky Motorsports concurrent contest:</u> Our friends at Big Sky Motorsports are sponsoring a concurrent contest that offers a \$250 prize to the most ravenous of our contestants. The prize can be split if there is a tie for first place. If you wish to participate in the Big Sky Motorsports contest you must wear a <u>new</u> BMW hat in the picture. Big Sky Motorsports is selling the hat for \$22.00 (regularly \$30) to club members. Additional info in the rules below.

### Rules:

Riders must register prior to starting the contest. To register for the Montana Riders' Café to Café ride, send an email to Kevin Huddy (klhuddy@hotmail.com). In the email include your name, T-shirt size and indicate whether or not you are also participating in the Big Sky Motorsports concurrent contest. Riders may register and begin the Café to Café ride at anytime up until the end date of the competition.

You must be a member of the Montana BMW Riders in good standing (dues paid) prior to beginning the contest.

To participate in the Big Sky Motorsports concurrent contest you must register with them by either visiting the store or telephonically. You must buy a hat from Big Sky Motorsports and wear that hat in the picture (not some old crusty thing you've got in a side case). Kevin will submit the contest results to Big Sky Motorsports and they will make the final decision on the winner of their \$250 prize. (You do not need to wear a hat to compete in the Montana Riders event)

The contest runs from 15 March until 15 November 2016

You must ride a motorcycle (two or three wheels) to the cafés.

If the café is closed you may still submit the picture, but please make every effort to visit the cafes while they are open. If you find that a café is closed permanently, then take and submit the picture and inform Kevin of the closure. A notice will be sent to all participants of the closure and submissions of that café will no longer be accepted. Please report any other issues you discover at a café so that Kevin can inform the other participants.

Those riding two-up should submit one picture showing both people; it will be considered a single entry.

The intended spirit of the Café to Café ride is to inspire members to ride more often and to do so with old and new friends. The intent certainly is not to approach the event as an Iron Butt ride in which the rider tries to visit as many cafes as possible in as short of a time as possible. With that in mind no more than three cafes may be visited in a single day and riders are encouraged to consume something in the café. Riders are also encouraged to tell the owner/manager that they're there because of the Montana BMW Riders' competition.

To prove that you visited a café submit a picture via email to Kevin (klhuddy@hotmail.com). The picture must show the rider in front of the café with the sign of the café visible and legible. If possible, also include the motorcycle in the picture. Include a time/date stamp on the pictures or indicate the time and date of the visit in the email. Size all your pictures so that they are 1MB or less in size. Please send in your pictures once a month and limit the number of pictures to three – five per email. No picture will be considered if received after 20 November 2016. We must be able to read the name of the café in the picture.

A participant may only count a specific café once.

The number of cafes visited, as proven by properly submitted pictures, will determine finishing spots. The top three places will receive a T-shirt. If there is a tie, then the riders will share the position. For example, if there are two riders in first place, they will share first and there will be no third place. If there are three riders in first place, then they will share first and there will be no second or third place finisher. The first place finisher(s) will also have their names placed on a perpetual trophy.

# CAFE TO CAFE RULES

### **SPECIAL CATEGORIES:**

**Distance Riders**: The rider who rides the furthest distance to a single café will receive a T-shirt. Distance will be determined from the rider's home to the café via the route selected by Google Maps. If a rider wishes to be considered for this recognition, then the rider must include their home address and distance ridden in the email in which the picture is submitted and indicate that he/she is competing for the distance recognition.

**Senior Riders**: This is category is for riders 70 years old or older. The rider in this category with the most cafes will receive a T-shirt.

**Vintage Motorcycle Riders**: The rider who rides a motorcycle made before 1991 with the most cafes will receive a t-shirt.

No rider will be awarded more than one shirt.

### SAFETY CORNER

With the current February weather acting like April, you're probably getting the bike out for your spring rides. I have a "trick" driveway...it faces south and when I open up the garage door, the sun spills in. Getting the bike out and rummaging around looking for the gear that I stored last fall, I get "tricked" into believing its way warmer that it actually is. As a result, my gear selection is often dictated by the abnormally warm temperatures in my driveway and it's not too far into the ride when I realize it's not nearly as warm as my southern exposure driveway.....with no wind! Can you say....Hypothermia: "A medical emergency that occurs when your body loses heat faster than it can produce heat, causing a dangerously low body temperature". The onset of hypothermia is evidenced by cold extremities....feet, hands, and as it progresses, your ability to move these extremities becomes limited. Let's see and on my motorcycle the hands and feet do what????....oh yeah, break, shift, clutch, throttle, turn indicators, horn, high beams.....! Progressive hypothermia begins to impact major body functions including the.....brain....and what exactly does my brain do???? So, as you begin your riding season, recognize the signs of hypothermia and be prepared. Simple ways...electric gear...vest, jacket, heated gloves or grips; each of these items help generate heat for your body parts and greatly reduce your body's task of trying to generate enough heat to stay warm. Secondly seal off entrances where cold air can get to your skin...your neck, chest, cuffs of your riding pants, where your gloves meet your jacket sleeves. Staying warm and physically able on your bike is a big deal...and as we begin riding in temperatures that are in the low 40's hypothermia is riding along with you, watch for it.


