ADVANCED RIDER COURSE Attendee

took the Advanced Rider Course (ARC) on July 7th in Great Falls, MT. My Rider Coaches were Rick Harerter and Brian Pound (who rides a Suzuki DR650). I took no photos so

you'll just have to take my word for it. There were nine participants in the course, seven of whom rode Harleys, and two of us on Hondas, me on my Africa Twin and another participant on a Honda street bike. The ARC is really all about riding. The "classroom" component to the course is minimal, and there is no written or riding exam. The intent of the course is to encourage riders to be honest about their approach to riding and level of risk-taking (classroom part), as well as to engage in drills that advance riding skills. Due to higher speed activities, the ARC is only offered in Great Falls, Helena, and I believe Billings. The day was full of activities addressing bike handling and cornering, proper riding technique, braking, and safety.

My basic philosophy on riding is to do what I can to stack the odds in my favor – to be safe and successful in whatever riding I choose to undertake. This involves being willing to learn new things, be reminded of things I already (or should) know, practice skills, and receive feedback on how to be more proficient. I have now taken the Basic Rider Courses 1 and 2 and the ARC. All have been valuable. I think my next course in a year's time will be the BRC2, which I found to be the most substantive of the bunch.



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

In 1957, Leopoldo Tartarini and Giorgio Monetti, two Ducati mechanics completed a 60,000 km (37,000 mile) trip around the world on this 175 cc bike and its twin. The adventure took the two riders across five continents and 36 countries over the course of an entire year making Ducati extremely popular and confirming the reliability of the 14 hp single overhead camshaft bike. Probably some of their skills as mechanics also helped. This beauty was seen recently in the Ducati Museum in Bologna, Italy.

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
