
I have discovered you are a group of pretty hard core adventure riders, who consider 200 miles before breakfast routine.

and the number of shirts you want before August 10<sup>th</sup> (*grandcrahm@gmail.com*) since I will order them then.






### **BILLINGS CENTRIC RIDES 2019**



- Cody to Red Lodge, or break off earlier if desired


This is a full day, one of the best rides in the country.

John has promised there is a story to follow.








### FSSNOC Thumper Cafe #48

Four Stroke Single Cylinder National Owners Club (FSSNOC) - the name says it all - is as Phil Haglund puts it, a bunch of old riders with nothing better to do. The MONTANA BMW RIDERS has at least four dues-paying-card-carrying members in good standing in this organization. Their most formal event is to congregate as some off-the-beaten trail café once or twice a year, with the goal of as many members as possible attending. Your Editor rode his BMW G310GS along with Kim Lemke on his Royal Enfield to attended this event (The Crossings in Wisdom, Montana) where we met Phil Haglund (Yamaha WR250) and Ken Conrad (BMW F650GS). Note the word "National" in the title. We were certainly local among license plates from at least as far as Alabama. I hope the photos adequately describe this event at The Crossings in Wisdom, Montana on the July 17<sup>th</sup>.

Airhead increased capacity oil pan, free to a loving and caring home. Should fit any of the early airheads, /6 or /7 and likely anything up to about '88 when they started changing stuff. The GS bikes have a shallower pan, even the early ones. The one thing to watch out for is for the deeper pan interfering with the center stand. On some it may or may not fit. Who ever looks at it should measure to see if there is clearance. Increases capacity by one quart. 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### **Safety Corner**



Don't we wish we could summarize safety into "Don't do anything stupid!". The problem is often, it's not what we do or don't do, but the guy in the vehicle who "does something stupid". Since we can't control "the other guy" and it does no good to curse his stupidity, we need to take our safety into our own hands and minds. There is an article in the most recent Motorcycle Consumer News entitled "Safety". Interestingly enough the subjects covered all have to do with the things that we can do help protect us from the "other guy". Some are technological applications to our motorcycles...ride by wire which includes ABS, traction and wheelie control, modulating throttle and brake input, etc. Some include the FARKLEs we add like lighting which has become increasingly bright and makes us more visible. Other technological evolutions include modern helmet construction coming out of the NFL and their concerns over concussions, heads up displays in helmets and even night vision adaptations to motorcycles. Finally, there is a section concerning air bag integration into riding gear and the Helite

vest (owned by Dick French, Kevin Huddy, Annie Huddy and others that I have seen at our club events).

So what's my point here? While it might be "retro cool" to ride in leathers or old waxed cotton gear, an old pudding bowl helmet with goggles and on a vintage motorcycle, none of these items incorporate the newest safety features and riding thusly exposes you to even greater risk. Our group is extraordinarily represented by folks on modern motorcycles using the latest personal safety gear. Way to go! Plus we have a high level of participation in continuing safety training and we compliment each other on these achievements.

Bottom line, if you haven't investigate the latest improvements in bikes, accessories and riding gear, do yourself a favor and tell your spouse the Larry the Safety Mom says its ok!!

# Large section of CO Highway 325 near Rifle collapses

The bank failure is in the northbound lanes of CO Highway 325 north of Rifle Gap Reservoir.

RIFLE, Colo. — A large section of the northbound lane of Colorado Highway 325 north of Rifle in Garfield County collapsed Friday, according to the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT).

The bank failure is in the northbound lane and is about 200 feet long by 8 feet wide, CDOT said. The northbound lane is closed and one lane; alternating traffic is being controlled by a portable stop light signal, according to CDOT.




