This means it's easier than ever before to enter. You'll have some stiff competition in this nationwide contest, but it's always good to see familiar names under the 'Montana' header in the published results. Last year we had nine Montanans complete the contest, which beats out our neighbor states (Idaho, Wyoming, North and South Dakota) plus Utah, Colorado, and Oregon. This year let's try get Montana into the double digits and throw shade on Washington!

Speaking of the BMW MOA, are you planning to attend the national rally in Great Falls this June 24-27? It really is quite a spectacle – three days of seminars, live music, demonstrations, vendors, and more. If you blended together a state fair, a vacuum cleaner sales convention, Woodstock, a sunburn care clinic, plus thousands of motorcycles and Medicare cards, you might get something that looks like this. Your admission ticket also buys you the opportunity to camp right there at the rally site (Montana ExpoPark). If that sounds appealing to you, then would you also consider serving as our club's Camping Czar? The responsibilities are minimal; mainly coordinating with Chartered Club Camping Committee Chairs Kevin and Annie Huddy to represent our club's camping area needs. Please note on the verification signature line of your mileage form that you have emailed photos to me for your starting or ending mileage. Other forms of verification are also allowed including recent maintenance performed by your local shop as long as the mileage is shown on the service order. Other allowances will also be made. Greetings! Since 2015, this has been the time of year when we remind everyone about our upcoming Tech-Day that traditionally takes place in mid-May. We look forward to the Tech-Day because it means the riding season is really here, we get to see friends we haven't seen in a long time and we meet new friends. We also get to help people prepare their motorcycles for the riding season. Sometimes the help is just providing a place for riders to do their own work, sometimes it is lending a hand, and sometimes the help means doing a job that is beyond the rider's ability. Thankfully, we've always had some generous support from some experienced motorcycle wrenches. We are confident we will have a Tech-Day this year and that we will again have some able bodied gearheads to help people when needed - we just do not know for certain when Tech-Day will take place. At this moment Tech-Day is scheduled

for Saturday, May 22<sup>nd</sup>, but we will not hold Tech-Day in May unless the US/Canadian border is open and crossing it does not incur onerous conditions such as a quarantine. Unfortunately, it does not look promising for the border to be open in time for a May Tech-Day. Last week the closure was extended to April 21<sup>st</sup>. We can expect that for any additional extension to be announced in mid-April. In any case, we will make a final decision no later than **May 1<sup>st</sup>**. Should the May Tech-Day be postponed we intend to hold Tech-Day on Saturday, September 18<sup>th</sup>, so please mark your calendars.

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




Hi Dick,




### **Reports from the Road - First Rides**



#### **New Members**



Many of you already know **Michael Reaves**, off-spring of long time club member **Chuck Reaves**. Mike got his start in motorcycling at an early age, about ten or eleven years old as he recalls, on a Honda 50 cc. He remembers test riding it, with no previous riding experience, on the Missoula County Fair Grounds, committing all of the errors and resulting falls as you might expect of a novice rider.



He did continue to hone his skills in the Blue Mountain Road area until a Yamaha 225, street legal

dual sport became his ride. He completed the Motorcycle Safety Foundation basic course before he had his Montana drivers license. He remembers riding the Yamaha on the "Bird Watch" trail (track) off of Roller Coaster road west of Missoula, as well as a portion of the Lolo Motorway. His ride during high school was a Kawasaki KLR 650 which carried him on some trips into Canada with his father. Next came a Suzuki DR650 and off-road riding in the Big Hole area. This sustained him until he fell heir to whatever bike his father was not riding at the time, usually a BMW F650GS.



Meet **Rebecca Coursey** from Bozeman. Originally from Baltimore, Maryland with roots, family and history in New Mexico, she has been associated with Montana since the mid-1980s as a student in Math education as the University of Montana.

Some of the club members may have met her at one of our usual stops, the Visitor's Center on Lolo Pass. Rebecca operated the center for two summers, 1984 and 1985 in its prior configuration. On a later visit, she was able to locate some the interpretive artwork she developed. She returned to Montana after a teaching career

in mathematics at a private school in New Mexico. A love of the outdoors, adventure hiking and camping eventually drew her to motorcycling, with the idea that off -road riding may satisfy her quest for adventure. She does not refer to it as 'impulse', but perusing motorcycle magazines, and many trips to the Bozeman Harley-Davidson show room, she put her money down on a 2014 Harley-Davidson 883 Sportster, with no previous riding experience, let alone training and a license. But the die was cast. Motorcycle Safety Foundation training and a license quickly followed, and the Harley ended up in her driveway, courtesy of the HD salesman. Determination overcame intimidation, and a nearby gravel parking area became her training ground. The drops became fewer, and rides became longer until she was an accomplished rider. Soon 8,000 miles per year became the norm, rides to New Mexico to visit family, solo trips to Orcas Island in Puget Sound, loops through Canada and just day rides around Bozeman. Not satisfied with 'just' riding skills, she signed up for track days with Red Pridmore, riding a track furnished Honda CBR





300. These sessions gave her seat time at Streets of Willow, Laguna Seca Raceway and Virginia International Raceway. Rebecca eventually acquired one of the track prepared Honda CBR 300 motorcycles.

### **New Members - (continued)**

With her eye on off-road riding, and camping, a 2019 BMW F750GS made its way to her garage, which is currently being outfitted with a lower suspension and seat to better match her frame. Just to ensure she has the skills to off-road on the BMW, she scheduled a full week in May 2021 with Motodiscovery's "Small Group Immersion Motorcycle Training" in Moab, Utah. Riding will be on a school provided Yamaha 250.

Rebecca now has a private practice, *The Songbird Healing Studio*, in the Rolf Method of Structural Integration (often termed "Rolfing") in Bozeman. Much of her work is influenced by movement practices, studies in Rolf Movement and Feldenkrais training. Motorcycle Riding has in-

creased a lot of understanding of the subtlety of weight changes, use of body in subtle and refined ways.

Rebecca has a daughter, Galen, who is near 27 years old, and also lives in Bozeman. Galen does not (yet) ride a motorcycle, but can out-ski and backpack a lot further than her mom!


Rebecca is looking forward to meeting other MONTANA BMW RIDER club members and participating in both the social and riding activities. We hope to see, and ride with Rebecca often.


West to Missoula, East & North to Deals Gap, the Finger Lakes and then up to Canada before heading south to Milwaukee.



### MONTANA BMW RIDERS Mileage Contest - 2021 - Larry Banister

With the return of spring and riding, we are back into our **MONTANA BMW RIDERS** annual mileage contest. If you're receiving the BMWMOA news, you'll have two forms in it, one for their annual mileage contest which ends March 31, 2021, the second for the summer contest...which would be the one we're copying for our Montana BMW riders contest. The rules or our contest mirror theirs in so far as the beginning and ending dates....Starting Date April 1, 2021, ending date October 31, 2021.

From that point of departure, we have a few different rules:

- 1) To participate in our contest, you must be a paid up member of the Montana BMW Riders.
- 2) To participate, you need to submit your name, address and the motorcycle or motorcycles you intend to campaign this year. You may campaign any and all motorcycles you own, but you must provide the make, model and year of the motorcycle and it's beginning mileage a/o **April 1**<sup>st</sup>. This information must be submitted in writing (via snail mail, email) to be received **BEFORE APRIL 30**<sup>TH</sup> in order for you to officially participate in this year's contest. (If you're participating in the national BMWMOA mileage event, you can send me a copy of the form that you sent to them.)
- 3) Unlike the BMWMOA's contest, we will accept any brand of motorcycle (see #2 above).
- 4) If you buy an new motorcycle during the contest period (or a bike that's new to you) and you want to use it in this year's contest, you can send me the make, model, year and beginning mileage of that bike and I will add that to your stable of qualified motorcycles.
- 5) I will remind all of our participants as we near the end of this year's contest (10/31/21), to send in your ending mileage which will need to be received before November 15, 2021.

Those who enter as per 1-4 above, and submit their ending mileage within the deadline, will be eligible for our drawing for CASH at the annual Christmas party.

It is a great year to participate. We have a number of club adventures planned, as well as the "2021 Adventure Riders Lookout Challenge" and the "One Room Schoolhouse Contest" contest, all of which are great opportunities to get out and ride. Additionally, if you're like me, perhaps this year will be a bit more conducive do riding with some friends... (think ride and eat!!).

Thanks for allowing me to monitor the contest again this year, I look forward to a great bunch of enthusiastic riders

### Dirt Biking big Bikes in Southern Utah


