

#### **New Members**



New Montana BMW Riders member **Jesse Mullen** purchased his first BMW earlier this year and joined the club shortly after. Jesse started riding six years ago, but motorcycle culture played prominently in his life while growing up in the Black Hills in Newcastle, Wyoming. As a teen he wrote and sold advertising for the Buffalo Chip campground newspaper published during the Sturgis Rally. It was during his summers working in Sturgis he decided he'd never buy a Harley.

Jesse's first bike was a 1999 Kawasaki ZRX1100 that he still regrets selling. Before buying his BMW, a 2014 GS1200, he rode a Suzuki 650 bagger with a too small gas tank. Jesse has limited adventure/dual sport experience, only riding a DR650 for a week in 2016 while on vacation in Quito, Ecuador. But he looks forward to spending more time on gravel.

Prior to COVID, Jesse and his brother Lloyd were planning a two week motorcycle ride in Colombia, they hope to reschedule the trip in 2022.

Jesse lives with his wife and kids a few miles outside Deer Lodge along with their five dogs, three horses and a mule. His wife **Sasha** is a veterinary technician at Clark Fork Veterinary. The Mullen's own the <u>Silver State Post</u>, <u>Philipsburg Mail</u>, <u>Bitterroot Star</u>, and <u>St. Maries Gazette Record</u> newspapers as well as <u>Browsing Bison Book Store</u> which has locations in Deer Lodge, Philipsburg, and Stevensville.

### Editor



Meet **Kerry Fee** from Livingston, Montana. Kerry, a third-generation resident of Prescott, Arizona started riding at age 15. While vacationing with his family in Oregon, his father presented him with a Yamaha 80cc Trial Bike. He gained his early skills on the trails and open lots on this machine, which cast his interest in "Trial Bike" riding.

As a teenager, he lived in Alameda, California where he finished high school, replacing the Yamaha 80cc with a Honda 90. It was also here that he continued with Trials riding. For this

he acquired a new Yamaha YT250 Trials bike that fit well with the fire breaks and fire trails in the hill east of Alameda. The Yamaha followed him to Arizona and saw extensive service there. He attributes this type of riding to enhancing skills in balance, throttle control and low speed breaking that has helped as he transitioned to adventure bikes.



#### **New Members (continued)**

While in his 20's, the uniqueness of trial bikes led to an unusual opportunity. Trial bikes run on very low tire pressure ~ 4 psi, and to prevent the tires from slipping on the rims, fit tightly, and almost always require special tools for tire changing. For this, he took his tire and wheel to the local Honda dealer, who just happened to have an opening for a 'chaser' in the service shop. Kerry was hired. At the time, this dealer had the maintenance contract for the California Highway Patrol's motorcycle fleet in the area, the famous Kawasaki 1000 Police Special. There was always a 'test' ride after each service. Kerry drew the 'check-out' test ride duties. He remembers surprising a few motorists while confirming the Kawasaki's were up to their pursuit potential. Kerry also added a Honda CR400, purchased



from this dealership, to his garage.

He set aside extensive riding to pursue making a liv-

ing and raising a family. He was probably the last of the breed, working for Royal Typewriter Co., as a repair technician, or repairman as they were called then. Royal had the maintenance contract the GSA (Government Supply Agency) equipment. Consequently, he visited Federal agency facilities in the Bay Area, most notably, San Quentin State Prison.

His family roots called, and he returned to Prescott where he ran a house remodeling general contracting business for 30 years. As a reward to himself for quitting smoking at 33 years old, he became a competitive Triathlete (bike, swim and run), following that for 17 years, see the adjacent photo.

He semi-retired in 2004 and moved to Montana. His wife, Sharon earned her PhD in Nursing from the University of Tucson (Arizona) and took a position with Montana State University, Bozeman. Sharon, who has owned two BMWs, a Harley-Davidson, and a Montesa Trials bike, encouraged him to return to motorcycle riding. He did, starting with something that matched his riding experience, a Honda 110 cc Trail Bike. It was not long before the trail bike was sold to **Mike Hofferber**, and replaced with a 2020 BMW F750GS, his current ride. This has also led to rides with Mike and other members from Billings and reported elsewhere in this Newsletter.








### Reports from the Road - Mike Hofferber




#### Reports from the Road - John Webster





The town of LaHood started as a stopping point for travelers and freighters that traveled between Butte and Madison County. The town is the namesake of Shadan LaHood, a Lebanese immigrant who came to Montana in 1902. He traveled the area in a covered wagon canvassing a dry goods firm. In 1909, he as his wife opened a general merchandise store where LaHood Park Steak House once stood.

The steak house burned in 2021, depriving riders of a historic destination point.
