I just got off the Regional Coordinator monthly call, membership in BMWMOA is still perhaps the most pressing issue. Efforts are being made to retain and increase membership. Hopefully National can continue to retain and increase membership as it is of course the lifeblood of the MOA. Let us do what we can to retain and increase membership in both clubs.

Since the National Rally, I have been busy with company and camping trips so no real motorcycle adventures to report from here, haven't been on the bike since I got back from Great Falls. Darn, oh well, such is life.

I was pleased to see a pair of women riders from my Sacramento club the, River City Beemers, placed 1st and 2nd in the BMWMOA mileage contest, Brenda Gay with 21,615 miles and Laura Strom Musgrave with 14,842 miles. Wonderful to see women so involved in riding and the club. Unfortunately, news has come that Laura was in an accident in southern Utah returning from Paonia and lost her life. Details of the accident are sketchy so I will not share what I don't know for sure. She was an admired and solid member of the RCB and much loved by her family and friends.

One thing that has been reinforced in my mind from the accident is the importance of keeping your mobile phone on your person. It was reported her bike was severely damaged and caught fire. Her riding companions (I feel very bad for them, they will never be able to unsee the accident) knew her number so the UHP called it to find the phone to call her "in case of emergency" numbers. Had UHP not been able to call the phone it may have never been found and much harder and slower to contact family. This contact would be even more important for a badly injured unconscious survivor to get family contacted.

Two summers past, another fellow I know was badly injured in ATV accident and unable to get back to his ATV. Thankfully he had his phone in his pocket and help was soon on the way. Had he not, he would have suffered quite some time before someone missed him. I don't get mounting a lifeline like a phone to the motorcycle and risking not being able to contact help. I wish at times I had a satellite phone for hunting and riding in poor service areas. I know I don't need to preach safety to this group, but wanted to relate these two incidents for your information.

While this is rather old news from the BMWMOA website, I don't recall seeing it before, so I wanted to share it as a good reminder of the importance of the BMWMOA foundation.

The BMW MOA Foundation launched an aggressive fundraising campaign at the 2019 Scoot, Boot 'n Boogie with a goal of creating a million-dollar endowment to fund the future of rider safety, education and training. Foundation President Chuck Manley said donations to the <u>SAFEMILES ENDOWMENT</u> will be specifically reserved for the purpose of creating a long-term endowment to guarantee future Foundation initiatives.

"Our first raffle effort was nearly ten years ago, and the Foundation has used those funds to provide important rider safety initiatives like our Paul B. Scholarship program," Manley said. "If we had started the SAFEMILES ENDOWMENT at the same time, we would have a \$1 million nest egg today to fund our training efforts forever."

Manley also said the Foundation is looking for donors at all levels, including a handful of key donors willing to make an annual commitment to the SAFEMILES ENDOWMENT. "Fifteen MOA members have stepped up and committed long term donations to get the fund off the ground," said Manley. "We have commitments for \$150,000 in donations toward the million-dollar goal, but we've tried to make it very easy for MOA members to donate at any level."

Donors to the SAFEMILES ENDOWMENT can receive Foundation incentives such as saddlebag medallions, Foundation polo shirts, one-year membership renewals and even automatic entries for Foundation raffles. "Our \$250 donation level was very popular at the rally because it includes automatic entry into the various Foundation raffles, a one-year membership renewal and several other incentives that MOA members deserve," commented Manley.

With the announcement of the SAFEMILES ENDOWMENT campaign and the ability to automatically enter Foundation raffles, the Foundation also unveiled two custom R nine T Urban GSs that will be the prizes in the fall Custom Bike raffle. SAFEMILES donors can receive an automatic entry to the Fall raffle as well as next year's Completely Vintage raffle and the 2020 Superstakes by donating now at <u>SAFEMILES ENDOWMENT DO-NATION PAGE</u>.

"It is a very exciting time for the Foundation with lots of activity," said Manley, "but, I am especially excited for future BMW MOA members who will benefit from these efforts."

Rider Profile - Wayne and Dawn Pastorius



Wayne grew up on a farm in the far northeast corner of South Dakota near lake Traverse. He started riding on the farm, his first bike was a Kawasaki 100 enduro which met a fiery end, ask him - there is certainly a story here for another time. He joined the Army right out of high school and spent eight years in the service, working on

years in the service, working on

all kinds of equipment including Bradley fighting vehicles and other tanks. After his discharge, he settled in Colorado Springs, CO continuing to work on military equipment for a government contractor. He moved to heavy equipment in 2007. He started working on forestry equipment in 2014 and became a field technician shortly after.

Dawn was born and raised in Colorado Springs, she also spent time in Prescott, AZ where her father moved the family from Craig, CO, after his knee was filled with screws end plates as a result of years as a motorcycle hill climb racer. **Dawn** was raised on and around motorcycles. Her mom had a 1976 Triumph silver Jubilee, #27 of 1000. Dawn would sit in front of her mom on the bike wearing a tiny purple helmet. Dawn spent 17 years as a professional driver, ten years as a semi-truck driver and, seven as a school bus driver. Her driving career ended after a botched foot surgery and three more to try to fix the damage. She now works as a medical receptionist at Natura Health and Wellness in Missoula.

Dawn and **Wayne** met in 1997 while they both worked at Checker Auto and were married in 1999. They spent two years as over-the-road truck drivers, as a team from 2000-2002. They decided to move back to Colorado Springs, where **Wayne** went back to 'wrenching' and **Dawn** continued to drive regionally. They bought their 1st BMW in 2008. It was a 2004 R1150, thinking they would "save" money since gas was so expensive and she drove about 50 miles a day to work and back. Little did they know all the money they would save, would be spent on buying other bikes, gear, camping gear, etc. After deciding that neither of them liked riding two-up, they purchased a 2002 R1100, which was too small for **Wayne**, so they bought the 2006 R1200GS that Wayne rides. **Dawn** still rides the 2004 and loves it.

They joined to <u>Pikes Peak BMW</u> riders in 2009. In 2010, **Dawn** was elected to the secretary position for two years and then spent three years as president. While she enjoyed her time serving, she was very happy to step down. She learned a lot and is grateful for helping the club create new events that continue to be club highlights on their calendar. She has a great appreciation for those who continue to step up and serve the motorcycling community. They both feel very blessed to have been part of the greatest motorcycling community. Many miles have been ridden and many friends have been made.




Rider Profile - Wayne and Dawn Pastorius (continued)



Year 2022 Dirt Ride Contest - Lance Lerum



After much discussion in our planning group covering the history of our club contests, reasons why we might have low participation, whether the members even want contests, what would make a good contest, and the workload required to come up with and administer these contests, we seriously considered forgoing contests for 2022. Ultimately the acronym of KISS came up ($\underline{K}eep \ \underline{i}t \ Simple, \ \underline{S}tupid$) and we decided to go forward with a couple contests that did not require too much effort in reporting or

even requiring dedicating the whole riding season to. I actually prefer the airhead slogan of 'Simple by Choice' as I really don't need a reminder of my mental prowess, or lack thereof.

This year we will have our traditional <u>Mileage Contest</u> and in addition I have come up with a contest for those of us that actually enjoy getting our bikes dirty. This will be a contest where members compete to record the longest dirt ride they can <u>in Montana</u> without ever touching pavement along the route (I needed some sideboards or we would likely have a length of Montana, MTBDR route). Members may devote a single day or multiple days on a ride, and submit routes as many times as they like. <u>I have developed a list of limiting rules so that we are all on the same page</u> which can be downloaded from the website. I have shopped these around to a few of our dirt riders (my thanks to them) to find loopholes and correct any ambiguities due to the difficulties in conveying anything in English without having several interpretations result.

There were several drivers for me personally in coming up with this contest. I love scouring maps, exploring while riding, seeing new country, camping out and riding lonely places; especially the mountains and prairies of Montana. I am hopeful that entrants will come up with some great routes that can be the start of a linked library of sorts on our webpage for others to access and download. When MOA came to us for ride routes, prior to last year's rally, it would have been great to have been able to point them to a good source for dirt rides.

In addition to members contributing routes and photos, I suspect that there will be some great stories of their adventures forthcoming that can be provided to Dick for inclusion in the Newsletter. Bear with me, but I have to share the following experience I had when I was chasing State Parks a couple years ago (*my favorite contest so far—Thank you, Grahams*). My plan was to head from Medicine Rocks State Park to the Tongue River Reservoir State Park on dirt county roads. I was rolling along fine on decent roads with just an occasional glance down at the Garmin to see if I was on track. The magenta line always continued straight up out of the GPS so all seemed good. I only had the Montana State Highway map, which has some pretty big blank areas on it, and probably should have had a more detailed map. But I didn't. It does seem that always having all the bases covered can make for a pretty boring game. I did begin to feel like I was drifting a bit south, but the Garmin wasn't complaining, so just soldiered on.

Eventually the road deteriorated into a single lane of two deep ruts typical of gumbo country (fortunately it was hot and dry), then up a steep hill, PRIVATE road sign, three dead coyotes hanging on the fence at the cattle guard. I thought 'OK. I'm lost. But I'm a Montanan and grew up with people like these, knew they likely were good folks, and have a reason for continuing on as I needed some directions.' I rolled into the yard and at least eight dogs barking and howling danced around me, just having the time of their lives alerting everyone in the county that someone was here. No two dogs were alike; a beagle, a heeler, a border, a bloodhound, a lab, others that may have been a mix of the previous, all going crazy. I wasn't sure what to do when an elderly woman on the upper deck of the house hollered down to me, "If that red one bites you, just kick him!" I tried to explain to her that I wasn't going to kick her dog but she

couldn't hear me because once the dogs heard the boss lady, they upped their efforts a notch, in an apparent effort to prove just how much value they were adding to the place. She waved me to come up to the house, which I did with no consequences from the howling hoard, all the time keeping a side eye on that red one. She met me at the door and handed me a glass of water (did I say it was a hot day?). I explained that I was heading for Broadus and might be lost. She said, "You might be, 'cause I wasn't expecting you." She told me I had missed a sign to Powderville 18 miles back at the top of the hill. I wasn't sure which hill might be 'the' hill but at least now knew I was 18 miles off course. After a short visit, I again navigated through the dogs and made it out of there.

Eighteen miles later at the top of a hill I did see the sign I had missed, which was on the other side of the road from a bloated dead cow, that was covered with a multitude of eagles, vultures, ravens and magpies that had drawn my attention the first time through. I love these rides and maybe weirdly, kind of enjoy getting lost and un-lost! I rode 150 miles that afternoon on dirt roads and only saw two other vehicles; one DNR fire patrol and one fellow wearing a beat up straw hat driving an early '50's pickup, who had to have been the model for a character in Ace Reid's 'Cowpokes' cartoons. It seems everyone else was at the county fair in Baker which I had passed earlier that day while running down from Makoshika State Park.

So do consider participating in the contest. <u>I'll put the rules up on the website</u> and there is no formal sign-up or starting date; just start when you can get out this spring and send me your routes. Let's plan to finish up by <u>October</u> <u>15th</u> before hunting season and bullets start flying out there. I've tried to minimize the reporting required and you can dedicate as much or as little time to it this season as you wish. If you have any questions, need clarification, or need help with downloading GPS tracks or alternate ways to submit your route and/or maps call me or send an email. We will figure something out to make this easy and a learning experience for both us.

Now go get dirty.







President's Corner:


Chuck Reaves reported that February weather was not conducive to Motorcycle Travel. We did have a good turnout at *The Montanan* in Lincoln MT.


