BMWMOA MEMBERSHIP

The MOA currently has an initiative to increase membership and as a Regional Coordinator based in Montana, I am authorized to grant a one-year primary trial membership to interested parties who have either never been a member or have not been a member in the last 5 years or more. This is, of course, in hopes that once you have experienced the benefits of membership you will renew.

The primary membership is the most popular membership for BMW motorcyclists. Primary members receive all the options offered by the BMW Motorcycle Owners of America in one package - twelve issues of the BMW Owners News, an annual copy of the BMW Owners Anonymous Book, full access to bmwmoa.org and the member forum area as well as all the money saving discounts and benefits.

What I would need from you for primary membership would be your name, mailing address, email, phone number and if you would be interested, or not, in being contacted for a discount on the roadside assistance program. I have been a member since 1984 and have always thought the magazine alone justified the annual membership and now really enjoy the Facebook page as well.

The additional cost roadside assistance and tire replacement (two tires per year) can certainly be a benefit if one experiences a roadside problem or needs to replace a tire to two. I have carried it for several years but have fortunately not had to use it yet, glad to have it in my pocket though. Here are some details.

It is the best of both worlds - MOA membership and our bestselling Roadside Assistance plans. One call to a toll-free call center dispatches a motorcycle certified carrier to your location 24/7 in the U.S., Canada and Puerto Rico.

Platinum Roadside and **Basic 100** plans cover the first 100 miles of your tow bill and the Basic 25 plan provides 25 miles of coverage. All three plans include trip interruption service.

Platinum Roadside offers BMW MOA members additional coverage for two tire replacements per year for roadside hazards and damage. All for \$109 per year including your MOA membership fee, which would be less with your first free year.

ANNUAL MILEAGE CONTESTS

Both MONTANA BMW RIDERS Club and BMWMOA have an annual mileage contest and members are encouraged to enter both. Participating in the Montana contest is fun for all and the BMWMOA contest shows folks that we actually ride in Montana. Send your contest documents for the Montana contest to Larry Bannister, his email is on the MONTANA BMW RIDERS website. The rules for MOA are:

All the MOA's mileage contests have the same general rules and process. To complete your entry in a Mileage Contest, please fill out the relevant form and mail it to the address below. A valid BMW MOA membership must be maintained throughout the Mileage Contest time period to be eligible.

Additionally:

- All miles or kilometers reported must have been aboard a BMW motorcycle.
- Beginning and ending mileage must be submitted on the official form included in *BMW Owners*News or downloaded from this page. Copies of the form are acceptable.
- Always include your BMW MOA member number on all correspondence.
- When entering miles or kilometers, always include the total mi/km on a bike with more than 100,000 mi/km with an odometer that has turned over to zero (0). For example, 25,000 mi/km on a bike that has gone over 100,000 should be reported as 125,000; over 200,000 reported as 225,000, etc.
- If you traded bikes or changed speedometers during the contest, send in the final mileage of your old bike and the beginning and ending mileage of the new bike with signatures from the dealer or former owner. If a loaner or rental bike is used, please provide verification of that mileage.
- If you live in a remote area and have difficulty getting signatures, that will be taken into consideration.
- The 2022 Summer Mileage Contest covers the period from April 1, 2022 through October 31, 2022.
 The 2022-23 Annual Mileage Contest covers the period from April 1,2022 through March 31, 2023. While the Start Form is your entry into both mileage contests, you may finish only one of the contests and the End Form submitted will determine which contest you finish.
- The Summer Mileage Contest end form will be included in the October issue of BMW Owners
 News and the Annual Mileage Contest end form will be included in the March issue of BMW Owners
 News.

• BMW MOA Mileage Contest Announcement

Because of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the MOA mileage contests will temporarily relax the signature requirements when submitting mileage contest start and end forms. An easy option is to email digital photos of your odometer readings to the MOA Mileage Contest Coordinator JIM LOW. Please note on the verification signature line of your mileage form that you have emailed photos for your starting or ending mileage. Other forms of verification are also allowed, including recent maintenance performed by your local shop as long as the mileage is shown on the service order. Other allowances will also be made. MONTANA BMW RIDERS ANNUAL MILEAGE CONTEST - Larry Banister



Ladies and Gentlemen..it would appear that spring is drawing closer. I have heard from some of you that you've already had your scooter(s) out of storage and have begun the riding season. With the arrival of riding weather, we'll be commencing our annual Montana BMW riders mileage contest on April 1, 2022..

If you're receiving the BMWMOA news, you'll have two forms in it, one for their annual mileage contest which ends March 31, 2022, the second for the summer contes - which would be the one we're copying for our Montana BMW riders contest. The rules for our contest mirror theirs in so far as the beginning and ending dates - Starting Date April 1, 2022, ending date October 31, 2022.

From that point of departure, we have a few different rules:

- 1) To participate in our contest, you must be a paid up member of the Montana BMW Riders.
- 2) To participate, you need to submit your <u>name</u>, <u>address</u> and the <u>motorcycle(s)</u> you intend to campaign this year. You may campaign any and all motorcycles you own, but you must provide the <u>make</u>, <u>model</u> and <u>year</u> of the motorcycle and it's beginning mileage a/o April 1st. This information must be submitted in writing (via snail mail, email, <u>text</u>) to be received **BEFORE APRIL 30TH** in order for you to officially participate in this year's contest. (If you're participating in the national BMWMOA mileage event, you can send me a copy of the form that you sent to them.)
- 3) Unlike the BMWMOA's contest, we will accept any brand of motorcycle (see #2 above).
- 4) If you buy an new motorcycle during the contest period (or a bike that's new to you) and you want to use it in this year's contest, you can send me the make, model, year and beginning mileage of that bike and I will add that to your stable of qualified motorcycles. Again this information must be submitted in writing as per #2 above.
- 5) I will remind all of our participants as we near the end of this year's contest (10/31/22) to send in your ending mileage which will need to be received before November 15, 2022.
- 6) Those who enter as per 1-4 above, and submit their ending mileage within the deadline, will be eligible for CASH at the end of the year. I'll tally up the final results in the presence of two other semi-honest and reliable Montana BMW club members and we'll publish them in the January 2023 newsletter with the checks to be mailed to the winners.
- 7) It is a great year to participate. As you have observed over the winter months in our club newsletter, there are a number of organized club activities in which to participate. Doing any of them will not only get you out and about on your ride, it will add to you seasonal mileage for the mileage contest. Now I ask you, were else can you: 1) get somebody to keep track of your mileage; and 2) reward your riding with the potential of CASH??!! Not only do we award cash to the individual who accumulated the most miles, we similarly honor the "average rider" (that individual who's total miles most closely matches the average miles ridden by all, and finally we draw a name from the hat of all others who participated for an additional cash award. All you have to do is submit your beginning and ending mileage as per the contest rules and time frame!!

Funny stuff comes to my mailbox in these interesting times... real cash came in one envelop from a long-time member. I was tempted to write the sender and say, 'at least you could have ironed the ones'.

We just took a driving trip to Phoenix for a short 11-day vacation. We went south through the Big Hole and then caught 15 at Dillon. Then HWY 15 all the way to a little berg called Nephi, Utah where we overnighted. You need not put that city on your bucket list. Product Report - Helite Air Bag Jacket




I specifically checked out the MaxMOTO display at the BMW MOA Rally in Great Falls with the intent of ordering a Helite Air Bag Jacket. After all of the necessary fitting, checking and exchanging of financial commitments, I was promised a jacket, but they acknowledged delivery dates were not predicable. The marketing people at MaxMOTO, Reno, Nevada keep me posted on the status - which was usually they had not received their order from France - a supply chain problem. So, 42 plus weeks later, the jacket shown in the adjacent photo arrived, with "Made in Vietnam" on the label. If it really did come from France, the jacket has more sea time than some sailors.



I also have a Helite Air Bag vest, which I tested, one of the reasons I elected to add the air bag jacket to my motorcycling wardrobe. The vest, when worn over a normal full-length adventure riding jacket seemed a bit cumbersome, so a full-length adventure jacket with the air bag incorporated would solve that problem. It did, to a certain extent, but with it on, I am fully aware of the extra bulk of the air bags and charging cylinder. Refer to the second and third photo on the left. It was delivered with the charging cylinder and a lanyard (not shown) installed as well as a zip-out liner. Replacing the cylinder appears to be similar to the process on the vest.

The charging cylinder, 60 cc of CO₂ gas is located on the right front of the jacket in a zippered pocket. It also includes protective pads in the shoulders and elbows and a wide and substantial protective pad over the spinal area of the wearer's back. I was not able to get a good photo of the 'air-bag', the green sections shown in the last photo. The air bag is positioned to fit between the normal back protective pad and the wearer's back, then around the hip area, up the front over each side of the chest and over the shoulder.





For those who may consider ordering this brand online, the size designation appears to have been on a small model. Mine is an extra large (I normally wear large in jackets) and it is not too large. One to two sizes over your normal selection should be considered.


The outer material is a tight weave, its thickness and stitching appears similar to another good quality jacket I have, also tested. Note: Not all of my jackets are good quality, but they have not been tested!



I have noticed that other members with air-bag vests are judicious about wearing them whenever they mount up. I have also become a believer.

I will bring it to the April meeting in Clancy, for examination.
