


Greetings, all! We have two topics to cover that are about things that will make your 2022 riding season safer, cheaper, and more enjoyable.

<u>First</u>, we are delighted to confirm that **TechDay** is back after a two-year break due to the pandemic. TechDay will be held on Saturday, May 21, 2022, at The Outpost.

TechDay provides an opportunity to get your motorcycle ready for a summer of riding by performing basic maintenance in a well-equipped shop and with the help of other experienced riders. The shop includes two

lifts, an air-compressor, a tire-changer, carb/throttle body synching meters, GS911 code reader and an assortment of other common tools. You provide the tires, oil, filters, plugs and other consumables. If you are having your tires shipped, you may have them shipped directly to the Outpost or bring them with you. Free disposal of oil and filters will be provided but used tires must be taken by the owner. If you are new to working on your bike, then there will be others there to assist, including with changing tires. If you are an experienced wrench, then we need your expertise as well.



This year we want to get as many <u>three-wheeled machines</u> at TechDay as we can muster. So, ride your Sidecar, Spyder, Ryker or Trike to the Outpost and participate in our group picture to be taken at 1400 hrs.





Starts at 0900 hrs. and runs until whenever on Saturday, May 21st. There are some cots and other places to sleep, park an RV or camp for those that would like to arrive in the afternoon of Friday, May 20th, and/or stay Saturday night May 21st. There will be a BBQ on Saturday afternoon and other sustenance for those who are arriving early or staying longer. **BYOB**. Due to the current monetary inflation, Annie is threatening to serve Top Ramen at the BBQ, but we'll have to see how that turns out.

<u>The second topic</u> is a reminder about our Safety Course Incentive Program (SCIP). The complete rules for participating in the SCIP can be seen at https://www.mtbmwriders.org.

The SCIP offers up to \$50 per member to reimburse the cost of taking a motorcycle rider's course that includes instruction on and practical application of riding skills and knowledge designed to enhance rider safety. The course can be focused on either off-road or on-road riding. A great source of training here in Montana is the Montana Motorcycle Safety Foundation. You can see the courses they offer and register at https://motorcycle.msun.edu.

Important things to remember: If you are uncertain whether or not a course you want to attend qualifies for the SCIP, then contact Kevin and he will let you know. Also, save any documentation you are given that shows you completed

the course. You will need it to apply for reimbursement.

We look forward to seeing everyone at TechDay and on the road this summer.

Steve became the proud owner of a Harley Davidson 250 Sprint, pretty cool for a teenager in the 70's.

As with many of us, the die was cast, and he became a life-long rider, and the owner of 36 different motorcycles since then. He found time in his 25-year career with Barnes and Noble Book Stores, at a store in Omaha, Nebraska to make almost annual rides, two-up with his wife, Natasha, to the Rocky Mountain area of the west. It was on one of these trips, a FSSNOC (Four-Stroke-Singles-National-Owners-club) outing in Wyoming that he met MONTANA BMW RIDERS Club member, **Ken Conrad**. In a similar situation, pie and coffee in Drummond, Montana that he met **Kim Lemke**. On another ride with Ken, he met **Kevin** and **Annie** Huddy, all MONTANA



BMW RIDERS members. He considered this a omen, and submitted an application to join the club.

Over the years, there seem to always be several motorcycles in his garage, with a new one coming and an old one moving on about every year. Although he has had the usual array of Honda's, Kawasaki's and Harley-Davidson's his favorite was a BMW R60. He chuckled at a 1970's barn-find Honda Gold Wing, for \$200. After several months of work, it transported Steve and Natasha on their next summer tour.

New Member Erik Berry Rider Profile

Meet **Erik Berry**, a new member, and lifelong Missoulian, and his wife, **Lauren**. Although no one in his family was a motorcyclist, Erik had the good fortune of growing up with friends and neighbors who were flat track racers. When Erik was 12 years old, the understanding neighbor saw no reason why he shouldn't be allowed to try out a 600-cc two-stroke flat track bike in the driveway. After a few stumbling stalls and a terrifying wheelie to the end of the driveway, his desire for two wheels had been set.

At 17 years old, a Yamaha Zuma scooter found its way to his garage to learn motorcycle basics, and that was soon joined by a 1988 Suzuki Intruder. The Intruder was the object of extensive customization through Erik's college years, with forward controls, stage 1 carb jets, straight pipes, lowered sus-

pension, and (most importantly) a large UM Griz flag. The Intruder was featured at many U of M Grizzly home football games in 2010 - 2011 as the stadium entrance bike for Monte. Monte infamously spilled the bike once when riding into the stadium, at which point Erik clocked one of the fastest unofficial 40-yard dash times as he ran from the tunnel to the laid-down bike on the sidelines. No harm was done, other than some rubber bits of the turf getting melted onto the pipes. Erik enjoyed many free heverages from Monte in the coming years as

free beverages from Monte in the coming years as payment. The Intruder was also critical in Erik's courting of his wife Lauren as legend says she was more attracted to the bike than Erik's dance moves on their first introduction.

Erik's father-in-law is an avid BMW R1200GS rider, and once left his GS in Erik's care for a few weeks. Erik enjoyed the BMW chassis so much, he soon acquired Chuck Reaves' R1100RS. Erik noted that he has known Chuck for some time - his mother babysat Chuck's now adult children. Erik was introduced to the Montana BMW Rider's Club by Chuck and looks forward to his first ride with the group.

Lauren, was born and raised in Anchorage, Alaska. The couple frequently visits to see family and enjoy fishing, cabin time, snowmobiling, and motorcycle riding. They typically spend a few weeks in Alaska every summer at the family cabin on Big Lake, halibut fishing out of Homer, and catching up with friends and family in Anchorage. In-law bikes Erik has borrowed have included a 1988 Honda Pacific Coast (fondly named the '88 Marshmallow), and a 2016 R1200GS. Erik's father-in-law is kind enough to let Erik borrow his R1200GS during his trips, allowing for ample exploration of the excellent rides Anchorage has to offer.

Erik's first experience of off-road riding came on a

2020 pandemic ride in Alaska. Spanning several days and about 1,000 miles of mixed paved and unpaved roads, Erik and his father-in-law rode GS bikes from

Anchorage to the Kennecott Mine outside of McCarthy, AK, and back. Erik rented a 2018 BMW R1200GSA via Riders Share for the trip. His "baptism by dirt" went better than expected, though the trip was filled with surprises. The journey included swarms of Alaska-sized mosquitos; catching air on surprise saddle-bucking frost-heaves; traversing 200-ft high railroad bridges; close-up riding by glaciers, rivers, and moose; a dead battery requiring a field-fix; lynx sightings; and Erik's new HJC helmet losing a retaining bolt at 80 mph on the rain/snowy last hour of the ride (requiring a road-side duct-tape repair). Motorcycles have access on the dirt trails above the Kennecott Mine, only accessible by bike or foot. It was above the mine on a dirt-track that Erik's rental bike's battery died, which required a coast down the trail in neutral, a battery transplant, and bump starts to get both bikes running. Alaska adventure riding upheld its name, and 2022 planned rides include the Denali Highway and Valdez trips.

Erik and Lauren have enjoyed many rides on the RS, though recently wanted something more comfortable for 2-up riding. In addition to a '57 Chevy Bel Air, the R1100RS now shares Erik's garage with a loaded 2011 R1200RT he purchased from BMW Motorcycles of Seattle.

Central Washington was in the low 40s and cloudy, but thankfully dry. North Idaho, 4th of July Pass, and Lookout Pass were in the 30s and mostly dry, with some wet (but not frozen) patches. After finally on Montana soil, the sun came out and Erik had glorious sunshine and low 40s for the final hours into Missoula.

Both Erik and his new ride attended the April Club meeting in Clancy. We hope to see Erik, his bikes, and Lauren at many more events.





Motorcycle Rider Safety Training

Montana BMW Riders Safety Course Incentive Program (SCIP) <u>Calendar Year 2022</u>

The purpose of the Safety Course Incentive Program (SCIP) is to encourage safe and responsible riding habits by partially underwriting continuing motorcycle skill education taken by members of the Montana BMW Riders Motorcycle Club.

GENERAL:

- 1. During calendar year 2022 \$350 is allocated to the SCIP.
- 2. **Kevin Huddy** is the administrator of the SCIP.
- 3. Club members can get a maximum of \$50 in a calendar year to reimburse the cost of taking an <u>approved</u> motorcycle safety course.
- 4. To qualify the rider must be a member in good-standing (dues paid) of the Montana BMW Riders as of 1 April 2022, as well as at the time the course is taken.
- 5. Courses offered by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (*https://motorcycle.msun.edu*), Lee Parks Total Control, RawHyde Adventures or courses created by the BMW Motorrad Performance Center are approved.
- 6. Members <u>must</u> request approval by Kevin of courses other than those listed in line 5. To gain approval, the course must include instruction on, and practical application of riding skills and knowledge designed to enhance rider safety; and may have either an on-road or off-road focus. Track days do not qualify.
- 7. If more than seven members qualify for reimbursement, then they will share the \$350 equally.
- 8. Only one course per member is reimbursable in a calendar year.
- 9. Requests for reimbursement must be made no later than October 10, 2022. Earlier payment of requests cannot be made since the total number of applicants must be known prior to allocating the money.
- 10. Submit requests for reimbursement to Kevin (<u>huddykl@gmail.com</u>); requests must include proof of successful completion of the course. Proof can be in the form of a legible copy, scan or photograph of the original document.
- 11. **Kevin Huddy** will coordinate with the club Treasurer, to arrange payment.

Reports from the Road - Lynden Clark - Death Valley National Park








I checked out Lynden's Honda 300 Rally. It was obvious it had a few "Clark Industries" modification. Shown in the photo above, is a powder coated mount for his GPS unit, and below that, a similar fabrication for the heated grips switch and various USB ports. The stock LED data display is mounted on top of that. He simplified the many electrical connections by installing a fuse block connected to the battery via a relay, so that it is activated by the ignition key. He also simplified the battery tender connection by mounting it to a piece of the body work with weather tight cover. Lynden said the suspension system for the generic rider did not match his 'mature' body weight; consequently he upgraded both front and rear suspensions for both an increased load and more adventurous riding. The modification proved themselves on the Death Valley ride.






