

#### Reports from the Road - Dan Hubing



Hi Richard, I thought I'd send you some pictures and a little story of my last trip from Green Bay Wisconsin where I currently live, to Missoula Montana where I will live starting in August of this year.

I'm riding to Missoula now and then I'll be storing the bike until I move the whole household later next month.

My first night was at the Fond du Lac campground just south of Duluth Minnesota, a very nice spot so if anybody's riding through there should stop in. Wear your earplugs because there's a lot of road noise but

it's a beautiful campground.

While riding west through Minnesota, the clouds started forming and it looked like there was going to be a large thunderstorm in front of me, so I pulled into a hotel in Grand Forks North Dakota and that's when the tornado sirens went off!





Now through North Dakota on Highway two, the winds are so strong I was actually in third gear doing about 30 miles an hour just hoping it wouldn't blow me over! I finally found a hotel in Stanley North Dakota where I'm staying now, I'm just worn out. I'll leave early in the morning and that's usually when the winds are less.

While gassing up in Glendive Montana, I noticed my clutch was very squishy and it was difficult to downshift. This happened last year when I was riding back to Wisconsin, I took the bike to the BMW dealer in Green Bay Wisconsin and they flushed out the min-

eral oil in the clutch cable. And that fixed it!

Then when I was riding in Glendive this year the same thing happened. I tried to get the cap off of the clutch Reservoir, which is very difficult by the way. So I went online on my phone and found some techniques on how to remove it, since I didn't have the specific BMW tool. With luck one of the local policeman stopped to see if I needed some help, since he noticed I had all my tools out in the parking lot at this gas station. Even better luck, he knew of a bike mechanic that was only a few minutes away. So this bike mechanic shows up, a dirt bike mechanic, and he help me get the cap off by depressing the two clips





and then unscrewing the cap. We squeeze the lever to try to get some of the air bubbles out and added a little bit more mineral oil that I bought at a local drugstore. And that seem to do the

trick. It's still a little squishy, but I am still able to upload upshift and downshift.

Now that I'm in Missoula, I'll take the bike to the dealer here and have them replace the clutch cable tube and the reservoir, since there must be a slow air leak in the system. The bike is a 2006 BMW R1200GS, with 85,000 miles on it. So this maintenance is probably a good idea!




#### Reports from the Road - Touratech Rally - John DiBari


