### 2 HELENA and BACK 2 Rally - Ken Conrad



True to its billing, all who wander are not lost, the Second Annual 2 Helena and Back 2 Rally in and around Helena, Montana was filled with some good wandering about. At various times over the three day event, coordinator Ken Conrad, Rob McCrea, Annie Huddy, Kevin Huddy, Dave Fishbaugh, Erik Larsen, Rebecca Coursey, Dave McCormack, Lynden Clark, Lance Lerum and Mark Ellzey participated in rides, dinners and adult beverages.

One of the rides was to Elkhorn, Montana, featured below. Elkhorn, one of Montana's ghost towns, was once an important mining town of the late nineteenth century. As with other 19th century boom and bust mining towns, Elkhorn succumbed to the drop in metal prices in the late 1800s. Some of the original structures are still standing, as shown in the photos taken by the group, and the Elkhorn cemetery, located on Cemetery Ridge south of town. The lack of complete data on many of the tombstones attests to the remoteness of the town, or perhaps the lifestyles of the residents and miners.

Although none of the riders kept a track, it appears they found frontage roads, and numerous off pavement roads to

make their way from Jorgenson Inn to Elkhorn. (Editor)

The objective of the ride shown on the track at the right was two fold, an abandoned rail road tunnel near present day Wickes, Montana, and the ghost town of Elkhorn, Montana.


According to the <u>Ghost Towns and History of Montana</u>
<u>Facebook page</u>, the tunnel is also referred to as the
Amazing Amazon Railroad Tunnel or the Boulder Tunnel.


In 1887, construction on the tunnel began. Crews worked from both ends. The north end was called Portal and the south end Amazon. When the tunnel was built, it was the longest railroad tunnel in Montana at 6,145 feet. The first train rolled through the tunnel on October 24, 1888.

Large wooden doors were added at each end and kept closed in winter to keep snowdrifts out and the warm air in. These doors had to be opened every time a train passed through and needed to be closed afterward.

Amazing Amazon Railroad Tunnel or the Boulder Tunnel



Elkhorn Mountain is the site for an authentic ghost town that has been dead for three-quarters of a century. Located at an elevation 5,500 feet above sea level, Elkhorn offers the ghost town enthusiast a bona fide look at a town that produced some \$14,000,000 in gold and silver. Panning started in 1870 and soon changed to hard rock mining when the quartz lodes were discovered. Transportation to and from the town was difficult until 1889 when the Northern Pacific Railroad ran track to Elkhorn.



### Report from the Road - Idaho BDR - John DiBari


A small group of riders mounted another trip to tackle what was, at least for me, the last pieces of the Idaho BDR I am planning to ride. I've now completed Sections 2 - 8 over the last several years. On this last ride, I did the whole trip with **Dan Siddens** -- a bit over 1,100 miles for me. More for him, as he started and ended in Bigfork, MT. Dan's friend, **Dave Fricke** from California, joined us for the first half of the trip.

We battled hazy skies that turned into down-right very smoky skies. Along the way we camped with several moose cows and calves outside of Sun Valley, ID. We all made it through the famous stream crossing north of Lowman, ID with nothing but some damp boots.

We endured a 25 degree morning that required Dan's bike to be jump started -- thank goodness, Dave brought a jump starter. We were all passed on a dirt road by two Porsche 911 rally cars -- a first for all of us. We saw lots of formerly burned forest and lots of beautiful parts of Idaho none of us had visited before.

At times the riding was challenging, with hills and rocks and ruts, and at other times we rode lovely, relaxing dirt roads. Dan and I completed all of Section 2 (Pine to Yellow Pine) and part of Section 3 (Yellow Pine to Allison Creek along the Salmon River). We cut short our trip due to poor air quality, but managed to squeeze in much our planned route, regardless. Although it doesn't count for the dirt road contest, we put together about a 211 mile stretch of dirt roads, save for some paved bridge approaches and decks, and a brief detour to use an outhouse (probably TMI regarding the outhouse).

The Idaho BDR route starts in the historic town of Jarbidge, Nevada and continues for 1,250 miles to Porthill, Idaho at the United States border with Canada.

Part of the route, ironically, makes a swing through the Montana towns of Darby and Lolo via way of the Magruder Corridor before making its way back to Idaho on Highway 12. There it branches off to Lolo Motorway.

The Backcountry Discovery Routes website, sponsored by BMW MOTORRAD, (Idaho Backcountry Discovery Route (IDBDR) Map & Information (ridebdr.com) connects you to an extensive amount of information on the BDR Routes nation wide.



### **CHECK POINT 4 - SCMA Three Flags Rally**

After a two year hiatus, the Southern California Motorcycle Association conducted the 45<sup>th</sup> Three Flags Rally over the 2022 Labor Day weekend. It was a five-day, 2500 mile ride from Mexicali, B.C. Mexico to Penticton, B.C. Canada. This is a self-paced ride that provides a great opportunity to ride the American West with any size group.

The last of the Rally's check points, number 4, was in Missoula and manned by volunteers from the Christian Motorcycle Association and the Montana BMW Riders club. Riding participants had their credentials verified and availed themselves to food, water, snacks and coordination with other participants.




There were 283 riders registered and 63 dropped out before the start in Mexicali. About 15 dropped out somewhere between Mexicali and Missoula. Based on the rider list at Check Point 4, there were at least 16 female riders.

Three riders went down South of Ennis. CMA member, **Jim Frazer**, visited the one rider who was hospitalized in Bozeman the following Tuesday. The rider, Lon, said two cars stopped suddenly in front of him and two other riders. He went down and was off of his bike. His bike came back up and drove in to the ditch where it gently settled down. He said no real damage to his bike. The rider, however, broke all his ribs on one side and some road rash but was well enough that he was heading home the next day. One of the other rider's bike was totaled but the rider was treated and released. The third rider was not injured and received minimal damage to his bike.

Your editor hung-out at the check point, taking photos and talking with some of the participants. Some of this is captured on the following pages.


So, how far do you have to ride, to ride 2,500 miles? **Greg Hintz** and **Don Deuel**, six time Three Flags Rally participants covered about 5,000 miles. They rode from Missoula to Mexicali for the start, then generally followed the most advantageous (road conditions, weather, overall time) to Missoula and Check Point 4, on to Penticton, B.C, then back to Missoula. Follow their route to and from on the track show on the right.

Weather wise, the ambient temperature in Mexicali reached about 115° Fahrenheit with similarly high temperatures through most of the southwest. The temperatures took its toll on several riders, who had to leave the ride.



### **CHECK POINT 4 - SCMA Three Flags Rally (continued)**

**Ogbonnaya Kanu** from Lagos, Nigeria may take the award for the rider, and his wife as pylon, for having traveled the farthest to participate in the event. He describes himself as the "undercover BMW guy" based on his previous participation in the Three Flags Rally on BMW's and touring in Africa and Europe on BMW's.

He is an avid motorcycle rider, as well as a successful businessman with a firm specializing in definitive and industry leading water conditioning expertise to the institutionalized and manufacturing industry. He became the first Nigerian to ride from Nigeria to Cape Agulhas, the southernmost tip of Africa. He has ridden motorcycles in 26 countries, using his own Nigerian-registered motorcycle in 23 of them. He sees biking as more than living a life of adventure and setting records, but also changing the way in which Nigerians are perceived.

In 2012, he became the first Nigerian biker to ride solo from Lagos, Nigeria to Austria, riding through France, Germany,



Austria, and Italy. He embarked on another solo trip from South Africa to Lagos. He then became the first Nigerian member of the Iron Butt Association, also known as the World's Toughest Motorcycle Riders, after biking 1,600 kilometers in 24 hours.

Kanu is the co-founder and member of the Board of Trustees of the Easy Riders Motorcycle Club of Nigeria, the first registered motorcycle club in Nigeria. He is also co-founder of the Ride Easy Motorcycle Training School, the Rise Easy Motorcycling Club of Lagos and the Superbike Clubs Association of Nigeria (SCAN) as well as the first and returning vice president of the Association of Nigerian Motorcycle Clubs.

When he is not undertaking some adventure, he works on perfecting his riding skills. He has taken a variety of courses in Europe, including BMW off-road skills and training at the California Superbike School in the United Kingdom.

And if you happen to be in Nigeria with a ailing motorbike, the AUTOSHOP Limited, is the place to have it repaired where Ogbonnaya is head of the Technical Team.

It was a pleasure talking with Mr. Kanu, an outgoing personality and, like most motorcycle riders, ready and willing to talk, about motorcycles and riding.





### 2016 Husqvarna 701 Enduro \$8,500 Negotiable.

Over 60hp, dry weight of 324lb, 6 speed gearbox, 115 mph top speed, 34"+ stand over. Clean title. 12,362 miles. Forks rebuilt (new seals) and revalved and converted to open bath by AMA Hall of Fame off road racer Ty Davis @ Zip Ty Racing. This is a dream project that I've been working on for two years now. But sadly, I need to abandon it and go to plan B, my 2016 Husky FE 501. The 701 has been lowered 4" because I am a burly 5'5", with 29" inseam and 135lb and even with these mods the 701 is too much for me.

The suspension lowering was done in such a way as to be easily reversible to stock or another dimension as desired. I even bought a kickstand for a 690 Duke to avoid cutting the stock 701 stand. (I have 13 shock springs and 10 fork spring sets to accommodate my various KTM/Husky projects.) Extras include a Flatland aluminum skid plate, a really

sleek white powder coated luggage rack, an aluminum case saver, a plastic skid bumper for the rear master cylinder, a printed service manual, a plastic guard for the rear ABS sensor wire, and Cycra handguards. Yet more: Tusk exhaust heat shield, extra seat, LED brake light and LED front blinkers and 2 12V ports; 1 SAE, 1 BMW.

It has four engine performance maps accessible without tools; mild, wild, normal and "bad gas." 2016-2018 Husqvarna 701 Enduro/Supermoto Pannier Racks by UK Rally Raid are really good looking and have been found used online.

Tires are Hidenau Dual Sport K60 Scout (R) with tread of 6mm and K60 (F) with tread of 4mm. The left button on the factory Trail Tech speedo has corroded because the speedo case leaked. Rocky Mountain ATV has speedometers for \$185.50. The original speed feature and odometers still work. Willing to consider Beta Evo Trials bike or Husqvarna 701 Vit Pilen or Svart Pilen in trade.
