

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## Mileage Contest 2023

Ladies and Gentlemen. In my review of last year's opening, I had said "it would appear that spring is drawing closer". As I write this opening this year, I'd have to say, "not so much"! With the temps forecast to be below 0 this week and snow in the forecast as well, I would suspect that riding is a thing in the distant future. That being said, the mileage contest will be commencing on April 1, 2023. Between now and then, if you're receiving the BMWMOA news, you'll have two forms in it, one for their annual mileage contest which ends March 31, 2023, the second for the summer contest - which would be the one we're copying for our Montana BMW riders contest. The rules for our contest mirror theirs in so far as the beginning and ending dates - Starting Date

April 1, 2023, ending date October 31, 2023. From that point of departure, we have a few different rules:

- 1. To participate in our contest, you must be a paid up member of the Montana BMW Riders.
- 2. To participate, you need to submit your name, address and the motorcycle(s) you intend to campaign this year. You may campaign any and all motorcycles you own, but you must provide the make, model and year of the motorcycle and it's beginning mileage as of April 1st. This information must be submitted in writing (via snail mail, email, text) to be received BEFORE APRIL 30TH in order to officially participate in this year's contest. (If you're participating in the national BMWMOA mileage event, you can send me a copy of the form that you sent to them.)
- 3. Unlike the BMWMOA's contest, we will accept any brand of motorcycle (see #2 above).
- 4.. If you buy a new motorcycle during the contest period (or a bike that's new to you) and you want to use it in this year's contest, you can send me the make, model, year and beginning mileage of that bike and I will add that to your stable of qualified motorcycles. Again, this information must be submitted in writing as per #2 above.
- 5. I will remind all of our participants as we near the end of this year's contest (10/31/23) to send in their ending mileage which will need to be received before November 15, 2023.
- 6. Those who enter as per 1-4 above, and submit their ending mileage within the deadline, will be eligible for CASH at the end of the year. I'll tally up the final results in the presence of two other semi-honest and reliable Montana BMW club members and we'll publish them in the January 2024 newsletter with the checks to be mailed to the winners.
- 7. It is a great year to participate. As you have observed over the winter months in our club newsletter, there are several organized club activities in which to participate. Doing any of them will not only get you out and about on your ride, but it will also add to you seasonal mileage for the mileage contest.

Now I ask you, where else can you: 1) get somebody to keep track of your mileage; and 2) reward your riding with the potential of CASH??!! Not only do we award cash to the individual who accumulated the most miles, we similarly honor the "average rider" (that individual who's total miles most closely matches the average miles ridden by all), and finally we draw a name from the hat of all others who participated for an additional cash award. All you have to do is submit your beginning and ending mileage as per the contest rules and time frame!!

Thanks for allowing me to monitor the contest again this year, I look forward to a great bunch of enthusiastic riders participating. My mailing address is: 102 Ironwood Place Missoula, MT 59803. So...if you email your mileage entries to me, please keep a copy of your email as I will not be entering the mileage until I get home in May. It is possible that your email may disappear into the black hole of the internet and when I look for it from home it won't be there. As I develop the roster for this year's contest, I'll send out a notice in the newsletter of all whom I have received an entry from. If you're not on that list, but can confirm you emailed me your info, you won't miss the entry deadline.

Al Murray, (Helena) the Secretary/Treasurer for the club made his first meeting in his new official capacity. Other notables were An-



At our most recent planning call (and first with our new officers...thanks for stepping up guys), Larry enquired about how much traffic our website was receiving. I'd been meaning to dig into that and report and he just gave me that bit of a boot that I needed to get it done. It is kind of, I guess, interesting is the word to use, to look at how people are finding the site and where they are coming from. The website lets me run some analytics reports to pull some of this data out of the software. The attached document lists some of those specifics but to summarize:

In the period from 1/1/2021-12/31/.2022 (last two years), we have had:

Visits from 38 countries, 46 states, and 69 Montana towns

Most users find us with a desktop, then phones, followed by tablets

Most visits come during the riding season, Apr-Aug...least in Nov

Visits in 2022 increased by 9%..12% were new or unique visitors.

Visits to date in 2023 have increased by 12%. 23% being new visitors.

We have had a bit over 3200 visits since moving our website to Squarespace

About 65% of visits are direct (likely members going right to our web address); followed by 30% Google searches and then a few alternative search engines

As I said, this is interesting and I'm not sure what might be done with it, but it does appear the site is moving in the right direction; if you are of the belief that growth is good. Maybe it can be used to pitch to advertisers that their ad is getting out there across Montana. I am able to drill down to see exactly which town in the world these folks are from which is fun, although I'm not so sure we would be able to convince those visitors from Lome, Togo or Kotzebue, Alaska to carry our banner forward to our lunch meetings.

Let me know if there are any specifics you might like to see pulled out of our site analytics and I'll see if it can be done. LLerum
