Well I did it. I sold my old 2002 R1150RT. It was a bittersweet day when I dropped the old girl off at my friend's house in Hamilton. My wife will be much happier to see only two bikes in the garage instead of three, and the money paid for two new tires for my new ride plus extra left over for a seat upgrade this winter and maybe some more FARKLEs yet to be determined. But I have to admit I was a little sad to see her spot in the garage empty. I made a lot of memories on that bike. It was my first BMW motorcycle, and with that came membership in the MOA and a few years later the Mt BMW riders. I rode her to a couple of BMW National Rallies and many lunch meetings with the MT BMW Riders. She faithfully carried me on two Saddle Sore 1000 Iron Butt rides and one Butt Burner 1500 ride. After doing my first two

SS1000 rides on a Suzuki 1400 it was like riding in first class to do the ride on the RT. So quiet and smooth, and I could ride 200 miles or so before getting fuel. The 1400 Intruder was sucking air at 138 miles so I planned my Iron Butt rides for fuel stops at 100 miles just to be safe. I got really good at fueling up while still straddling the bike and many fuel stops were less than 5 minutes. I soon learned that a quiet bike is a joy to ride. I had put straight pipes on the Intruder just to be cool and boy it did a good job of making noise. Loud pipes may save lives, (I would like to see the research on that) but they also upset a lot of folks. My neighbors on Christian Drive in Missoula were glad to see the Intruder gone. It is so calming and peaceful to ride with the only noise coming from wind that finds its way around the fairing and windshield and the RT did not allow much of that. That's also the first bike that my wife and I took a trip on, she was never really excited about riding. Riding over the Going-to-the-Sun Road on the RT was fun and she got to experience all the good things about riding - sun in your face, the smells and sounds you miss while in a cage. I hope I can get the seat situation on the Super Tenere fixed so she will be willing to try touring again. I have an Airbnb reserved in Redmond, Oregon for the National BMW MOA Rally next summer and the plan is to ride out to the Rally and then go over to the Oregon coast for a few days.

I am glad that a friend has bought the old RT. He has plans to ride in Canada for several months next summer and the old girl would be more than willing to take that on. He is an expert motorcycle mechanic so I know he will take care of

all the little things that need to be done to get her in tip top shape. I tend to just ride, I take care of major maintenance things but tend to let the pesky little things be until they become bigger problems.

Hope many of you can make it to Ennis for the lunch meeting on the 17th. Lots of different routes to get there with great riding. As always RIDE SAFE!

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CENTRAL MONTANA EVENT - Editor





Greg and Phil left Missoula Friday, dodging rain showers and essentially covered most of the roads in central Montana to arrive in Lewistown.



My initial impression of Lewistown was its reputation for being the geographical center of Montana. For the purists, this is subject to some debate, and neither academic nor empirical calculations seem to be available to substantiate this claim. Some handwritten notes, signed by a person purporting to be a surveyor attests to this claim, are posted in the lobby of the Yogo Inn, which seems to be sufficient for the local lore.

As with many of Montana's towns with a past, Lewistown has a history that is worth some attention. The first residents of this location were thought to be Métis people, descendants of the union between European fur trappers and indigenous people, who frequently spoke French. These residents date back to the early fur trading in the area. It became a trading post (named Reed's Fort) in 1873, renamed Lewistown in 1899, and the terminus of the Central Montana Railroad in 1903, a spur line of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul & Pacific that was crossing Montana at the time. The railroad helped Lewistown become the central distribution point of the Judith Basin.

The Yogo Inn, our basecamp for this event, was initially the site of the Milwaukee Rail Road Train Depot, and was completed in 1913. The inn gets its name from the Yogo sapphire, a gem unique to central Montana.

I am frequently surprised by the notable, as defined by WIKEPEDIA, people that were born in these small Montana towns. For our football fans, **Bobby Petrino**, a football coach was born in Lewistown and went on to be the coach for the Atlanta Falcons of the National Football League.

My surprise was a fellow classmate at Montana State University **Loren Wilber Acton**, a physicist and astronaut who flew on a Space Shuttle mission in 1985 as a payload specialist, who calls Lewistown his hometown.

Notable, at least to the Montana BMW Riders, is **Tom Moe** who got his start as a rancher and farmer in the Judith Basin on his family's farm just outside Lewistown. This is his 'hometown' also.



Beartooth Rendezvous- 2023 - Kevin Huddy
















Report from the Road - Chuck Reaves




ATGATT - Mike Hofferber

Our MONTANA BMW RIDERS understand ATGATT, believe it, and live by it. **Mike Hofferber** an **Gary Armstrong** were riding with a fellow enthusiast that Mike met at the annual camp out sponsored by Amanda Zito, a. k. a. "As the Magpie Flies" of Utube fame. It was one of those casual and relaxing rides on a paved two lane secondary road, and the 67 year old rider, from Seattle, took evasive action at 65 mph to miss a dog. He ended up in the ditch beside the road, suffering a broken sternum, dislocated shoulder, ruptured spleen, broken ribs and minor abrasions. He attributes his survival to a full face helmet, and a full body armor coat. He spent two days in ICU, hospital two more days, and five days in rehabilitation.

One other take-away, never ride alone.

SAFETY - Kevin Huddy & Mike Meridith

Gene Sullivan, a former MONTANA BMW RIDER, was making his way from Colorado to visit, and ride with **Mike Meridith** when his rear tire on his BMW R1200RS blew out about three miles east of Harlowton, Montana. Gene reported the failure was sudden without warning, but the bike remained stable until he stopped. The tubeless tire remained on the rim, so Gene nursed the bike to Harlowton where Mike retrieved both Gene and his bike. A new tire and a visit to **Huddy's** tire repair shop, had them on the road again.

The tire, a name brand top-of-the-line model was appropriate for this bike and was not being ridden over its speed rating. Gene, considered an well experienced and capable rider was not aware of anything in the roadway, nor of any impacts that would have

initiated the failure. As shown by the photos, ample tread remained. A view of the interior of the tire, photo bottom right, there was no indication the failure may have started inside the tire. There was no rim damage indicating impact on a sharp edged pothole.

The failure is yet unsolved. Gene plans to bring this to the attention of the tire manufacturer for their analysis. We will try to keep up with the outcome of the manufacture's review and post it in a later Newsletter.

It was tested by the Honda dealer in Helena, showing it meets its stated capacity. I can provide a copy of the test data upon request.



Battery dimensions are: 5-7/8" length x 4-1/4' tall x 3-3/8" deep. Positive terminal is on the left.

This battery was a \$209.45 cost, no installation cost, at the Missoula Honda dealer. The receipt is available upon request.




You can't get there without a passport, places




