
## Annual Mileage Contest - Larry Banister

For those of you who were unable to attend the Missoula venue of the Montana BMW Riders Christmas party, we had a great time, a great meal at the Den and enjoyed a brief glimpse of sunshine.

By way of recap, 2024 was a banner year for our riding contest. While our total number of participants was down slightly from last year, we had a 7% increase in the number of miles ridden by all participants compared to last year and a 66% increase in total number of miles ridden by all participants compared to 2022. So we're continuing to fulfill our duties of keeping the oil changes coming, new tires put on


the bikes and maintaining the BMW riders image as serious motorcyclists.

The total number of miles ridden by all participants this year was 104,042. Our high mileage winner is **William Parker** who accumulated 18,613. For his efforts William's name is indelibly inscribed on our "Mileage Plaque of Honor" which will be displayed at Big Sky BMW this coming year. In addition, a check will be mailed to William in the amount of \$75.






"I haven't finalized trip plans, but for 2025 I'm considering the following:


- a) some weekend trips in the east Kootenays / Creston / Kaslo areas on the RT




