Rider Profile - Mark and Loretta Olson



I was hooked on bikes ever since my sisters boyfriend showed up on a shiny Triumph Bonneville in the mid sixties. The look and sound of that bike really hooked me! It took awhile to get on two wheels. My very first bike was an old Yamaha 305 street bike that was given to me by a gas station attendant. Someone had left it there, not running, and had never come back for it!! My lucky day I thought.

My first real bike was a Triumph 650 Bonny from the early 70's. Also not the most reliable bike. Ran over my own muffler one day! Than I got my first brand new bike, a 75 Triumph Trident. Great bike with some serious flaws due to the British bike industry imploding. My wife and I took our only long distance ride on that one. Three days into it I realized she

had stopped talking to me!! Turns out camping on a bike wasn't as high on her list of things as I thought! She wanted a room with a bed so we got a charming cabin somewhere near Telluride, Colorado, only the mattress was so old and worn out we could barely walk the next morning!

I took a memorable ride from New Mexico out to California then up to Montana where my dad was living at the time on the Trident with no issues except fatigue and a sore butt! Ran into a fellow and his girl somewhere in Montana out of gas on his Harley custom with a peanut tank. Couldn't get 100 miles before going dry, so I gave his girl a ride to get gas and got them on their way. When I got home I had one dollar left, which was the dollar he had given me as a thank you for getting him gas!!

I believe my wife loved that bike because I did and she even bought me a new three into one exhaust for it after I did some major repairs on it and then I realized I better keep her so we got married soon after!

My first BMW was a dark burnt red R100RS. It was like the dawn breaking on a new day of riding. Smooth, fast enough, and decent handling. And perfect for two up too. Only flaw was a dodgy circuit board that took forever to diagnose. Then we started our family and left bikes behind for awhile. I couldn't stay away though, so several Yamahas, Kawasaki's, Hondas, etc. followed.

I've had several dozen bikes since, mostly BMW's and modern Triumphs, even three Harleys and a Victory bagger. Almost all good bikes except the one Harley that literally vibrated like a paint mixer at several different rpms! I've

been very lucky as far as accidents and injuries go. Ran into a guard rail on a new Triumph Tiger 955i that I had just purchased. My sister was a nurse and she came by to check on me and pointed to my knee and told me the white part I could see was my bone, so yes go to the hospital you idiot!

My current main bike is a 2016 BMW R1200RT. It's probably the best all around bike I've ever owned, fast, great handling, comfortable with all those extras that modern BMW's have. I recently picked up a 2003 BMW R1200CL which I haven't really ridden due to the long thing called winter up here. Still have my 92 R100RS with almost 100k on it that is still a lot of fun. An old Triumph Tiger 650 from 1958 that is one of my retirement projects. And my Honda XL 350 dirt bike that's fun as well.



I'm currently looking to pick up a larger off road bike to explore all the great dirt roads in this great state and surrounding area. Probably a new Triumph Scrambler 1200, they look a lot like the old Triumphs that seem to be ingrained in my brain as what the perfect motorcycle should look and sound like. I find modern bikes to be so amazing compared to the old days, they just run and run with minimal maintenance. I have a friend with a 1959 Triumph Bonneville and the owners manual is at least half an inch thick with instructions on decoking the cylinders and even how to rebuild the whole motor!!!

Founded over 150 years ago, Lincoln began as a mining outpost during the gold boom of the 1860s. The area was explored by Meriwether Lewis during his return journey to St. Louis in 1806. He followed the famous "River of the Road to the Buffalo," a trail created by Native Americans centuries before.

Gold discoveries in the mid-1860s attracted miners to various camps in the region. The town of Lincoln was eventually established when the nearby Lincoln Gulch was abandoned in favor of the present location.

A little over 206 miles, great ride for a season starter.





Lolo Pass

The 'Right-of-Passage' to the each new riding season for those in the Bitterroot and Missoula valleys seems to be who can make it to the Visitor's Center on the top of Lolo Pass on Highway 12.

Judging by the snow levels, **Lyden Clark** may have been first this year, but **Greg Hintz** and **Don Deuel** were close behind. **Dave McCormack** and **Terry Pohland** were certainly the first of the CAN AM riders, even without photographic evidence, and also included a slightly slippery ride to the Lochsa Lodge.

Gravelly Ride - 19-21 July - Mike Kreikemeier & Jay Cowan

The idea behind setting up a ride in the Gravelly range was to pick a date that folks could gather at a campground, camp for a few days to do some dirt and gravel riding and experience a place in Montana less traveled. At the end of the day share stories with folks about what the roads and scenery were like. Make plans for the next day. Repeat.... As of now there are no plans for guided trips, just suggested routes.

Best to bring food to cover the duration. Water and Ice will be provided. Beverages will be available. The food situation could change but for now plan to feed yourself all three days. Be bear aware. There will be vehicles available for food storage.

Some folks are arriving on the 18th so they can have two full days riding. The easiest way to Cottonwood CG is from Alder.

The road conditions vary from gravel roads you could carefully ride a road bike on (if you are comfortable riding gravel) to rutted dirt roads that are better on a GS type bike. Some of the non-graveled roads turn to gumbo in the rain so the day's weather should be a consideration when planning dirt roads. Especially true for the North Valley Road running East-West just north of the Red Rocks Lakes National Wildlife refuge.

All things considered... it is probably not good to be on a road bike in the Gravelly range.

The travel Restriction maps, and Forest Service maps are available at the Beaverhead - Deer Lodge National Forest website: https://www.fs.usda.gov/main/bdnf/maps-pubs.

If you Google, the Cottonwood campground there seems to be ten official camper spots on the West side of the road and 5 or 6 spots on the East side of the road. There are also places up stream where I have seen folks just pull off the road and park the camper near the Ruby River. There are no facilities except toilets I do not remember any potable water stations. No reservations can be made. Consequently, we are going to have to share what spaces we find. In the past, during July, I have seen very little use of the campground. Hunting season is a different story. Hopefully, we will have a count of the number of campers that will be coming and make it all work.

Our expectation is to share more information as it unfolds and have important details finalized by the 1st of July.

The boxer engine/transmission unit has an alternator and center stand. A front fork & 17" dual disc alloy wheel with ABS ring and a mounted Shinko 120/70ZR17 F009RR tire is included.

- The VIN: WB1041601R0310119 stamped on the top right frame decodes to a 1994 R1100RS.
- The Engine Number: 112EA 0497 7489 appears to confirm it's from a <u>1994 R1100S</u>.
- The Transmission Number is: 005453EAF.
- The Frame Number: 2311605, is on the front of the head tube.

Obviously, these components were part of a build, rebuild project. With yellow painted notations as to oil and torque, I assume the engine/tranny was a replacement obtained from a recycler.

<u>While I do not have any information as to prior usage or condition</u>, the left side <u>cam chain tensioner fix has not</u> been performed.
