Presidents Corner — Larry Manchester



I just got back from riding to Big Fork for the June Club meeting at the Echo Lake Cafe. We had a good turnout for lunch and the weather was good although pretty warm. I have to admit I am pretty tired as My wife, and I just returned Friday from our big adventure to Redmond and beyond. I asked her if she wanted to ride to Echo Lake with me and I got a very firm no!

Two things I have had on my bucket list for some time were: (1) Ride to a BMW National Rally with my wife, and (2) Visit the Bigfoot Museum in Willow Creek California. When I heard last year that the 2024 MOA rally would be in Redmond, Oregon, I knew this was the chance to complete these

two bucket list items. I started planning and convinced Linda, my wife, to join me on this adventure.

I call this ride the Mt/Mc Adventure (Marriage Test/Motorcycle Adventure). We had a great time and made many memories along the way. We covered 2,245 miles riding two up on my Yamaha Super Tenere. We left home June 12 after dropping Daisy, our Great Pyrenees dog off at the Kennel. We rode over Lolo Pass on highway 12 to Koskia and on to Grangeville and then Riggins Idaho for the night. Ran into some nasty road construction from White Bird Pass to Riggins. Road construction became a daily occurrence on our trip, we had to wait for pilot cars on several occasions in several states.



We slept well on night one and were anxious to hit the road for Day two. Rode from Riggins over to Payette, Idaho and had lunch with a good friend. From there, we continued on to John Day, Oregon. It was hot from Vale to John Day but the Super Tenere ate the miles up and we arrived

shortly after 4 PM, Pacific time, tired but looking forward to Redmond and the MOA Rally.

Day 3 was a shorter ride to Redmond. It's a great ride from John Day to Redmond through the Ochoco National Forest and we got to Redmond at 2 PM. We registered at the Rally and checked in to the Airbnb I had reserved in January. Luckily the Airbnb was only a 10 minute drive to the Rally Site so we went back to the Rally and visited some of the vendors and displays. We met up with the Montana crew that was camping at the Rally.

Day 4 was spent at the Rally as well, unfortunately a cold front was moving through, and the temperature had dropped a lot and the wind had picked up as well. Lots of folks bundled up trying to stay warm, we were glad to be in the Airbnb and not in a tent! Many Rally goers left early trying to get away from the cold, and the attendance at the Saturday night entertainment was down from years past.

Day 5 had us riding from Redmond south to Highway 138 and through the Umpqua National Forest. It was 42 degrees and spitting rain at the higher elevation, so we stopped and layered up. Thankfully we had brought along extra coats and rain gear, so we were fairly comfortable. As we descended down the west side to Roseburg, Oregon it warmed up some. We stayed in a cute Motel in Coquille, Oregon, and I had reserved the Bigfoot themed room. Bigfoot memorabilia was all over the walls and a giant Bigfoot Mural was looking over our bed. Linda was not impressed.





Day 6 and to the Coast at Bandon, Oregon. Spent some time on the beach, took some great pictures of the lighthouse. Wished we had more time to spend exploring but still had some ground to cover.

The riding along Highway 101 was challenging, strong gusty winds blowing in off the Ocean kept me on



my toes. Riding two up, and with both panniers and the Top Box stuffed with luggage I think total weight was around 900 pounds. But the wind still was able to push us around some and with the heavy traffic I had to stay focused, so I was not able to enjoy much of the Ocean views while riding.



The Redwood National Forest is beautiful and probably the most enjoyable riding of the whole trip. We stopped at Prairie Creek Redwoods state park and took a short hike among the giant trees. We vowed to come back again when we could spend more time, we barely touched the surface of all there was to see. Lessons

learned: allow for more time to explore and less time for riding.

That evening we arrived at Willow Creek, California and the Bigfoot Motel. Again, Linda was not amused. Did I mention she is a non-believer?

We spent a couple of hours visiting the Bigfoot Museum on the morning of



Day 7. I was in my happy place and Linda tolerated my acting like a kid in a candy store. Willow Creek is an interesting little town. The Museum curator told us the main economic driver about 10 years ago was Marijuana. That was before it was legal in California, evidently there were a number of little farms in the area tucked up into the hills and valleys who grew weed. Now that it's legal and most of the small farms have gone under, and now the main economic driver is tourism. I think weed is still a large part of the community, I met quite a few folks who seemed to be

high or maybe just overly friendly. They have a big Cannabis store on Main Street now. We rode through the Shasta-Trinity National Forest after leaving Willow Creek and dropped down to Redding, California. Temps were in the high 80s and traffic was insane. The traffic let up as we continued on highway 299 Northeast towards Alturas, California where we spent the night.







The Super 8 Motel in Alturas was hosting a large group of Antique Car and Motorcycle enthusiasts. On the morning of day 8 I visited with some folks in that group. In particular, two guys who had some really neat bikes. One was a 1914 Excelsior and



the other a 1915 Harley Davidson. These guys were riding these machines on a three day loop in the area. It's amazing to see how technology has changed motorcycles in the last hundred years.

We left Alturas and headed north on Highway 395 to Burns, Oregon and then east on 20 to Juntura, Oregon where I had a reservation at the Oasis Motel. If you ever passing through that area just keep going. On the whole trip that was the worst experience. The Motel looked as though it was built during the depression and had never been updated. The Cafe was similar and I think they were still using the grease from years past. Had we not been so tired, and the next town was 60 miles away we would have canceled and left. We toughed it out for the night but left early the next morning and were glad to see Juntura in the rear view mirror.

Day 9 and we had a great breakfast in Vale, Oregon. Mentioned to the waitress about our stay in Juntura and she seemed shocked that we actually stayed there. The locals in Vale know better than to stop at Juntura. We had a nice ride through Ontario, Idaho and then north on Highway 55 to Banks and the Lowman cutoff to Highway 21. The Sourdough Lodge was our final night on the Road. It is a great little place with cute, clean cabins and a great Cafe and I highly recommend it.



Day 10 and headed home. The ride to Stanley is great, with the Sawtooth Mountains as backdrop. Lots of curvy roads from Stanley to Challis and then along the Salmon River to Salmon. Recharged with a good lunch in Salmon and pointed the Bike towards Lost Trail Pass and the Bitterroot Valley. The final day was a long one, 274 miles and it felt really great to pull into our driveway at 4PM. That left us time to go pick up Daisy at the Big Sky Kennels, she was glad to get home also!

I mentioned earlier that this was a Marriage Test/ Motor-cycle Adventure. Our marriage is intact. Linda was a real trooper. She had never ridden more than 150 miles so

this trip was quite a step up. She got a little grouchy at times, but if you had to stare at the back of a High-Vis helmet for 10 days you would be a little grouchy too.



You are never too old to take on new adventures. I looked for all kinds of excuses to back out from the trip, but Linda kept pushing me saying we should go and check off those two items from the Bucket List. I did learn that riding two up is a lot different than riding alone. The bike handles differently, but most importantly you tend to think about that loved one sitting behind you. I rode more conservatively and safely. After all, we promised five grandkids that Grandma and Grandpa would come home safely from our Motorcycle trip.

On a side note the Super Tenere was flawless on the trip. I averaged 52 miles per gallon without any hiccups. With the new Seat Concepts seats it is a competent long distance machine. So get out there and ride, push yourself to do things that are out of your comfort zone and make memories.



DAY 1.

Rode 409 miles, mostly in heavy winds, to just north of Twin Falls, ID. Tomorrow we will be at NAS Fallon, NV.

We chose a route that took us around Carson City to eastern shore of Lake Tahoe and then north along the shore and then on north to Graeagle, CA. I planned to get some great shots as we rode along the shore. That didn't happen. The traffic was horrendous and every pull off was packed. It wasn't until we got well north of the lake that the traffic abated. We are at our friend's place near Graeagle, CA. He lives In a quiet, heavily forested and mountainous rural area. We rode thru the central valley of CA in 107 degrees weather. Made it to the coast at Mendocino. The road in was twisty and steep and involved what Annie calls "Moto-Wrestling". The views along the coast in 60 degree temperatures made the ride worth the wrestling.



Saw some big trees along the way






We were encouraged to see a significant representation of sidecar rigs. Others were at the Rally but did not make this photo.





- The VIN: WB1041601R0310119 stamped on the top right frame decodes to a 1994 R1100RS.
- The Engine Number: 112EA 0497 7489 appears to confirm it's from a 1994 R1100S.
- The Transmission Number is: 005453EAF.
- The **Frame Number: 2311605**, is on the front of the head tube.

Obviously, these components were part of a build, rebuild project. With yellow painted notations as to oil and torque, I assume the engine/tranny was a replacement obtained from a recycler.

While I do not have any information as to prior usage or condition, the left side cam chain tensioner fix has not been performed.


