Safety Course Incentive Program - Kevin Huddy



The purpose of the Safety Course Incentive Program (SCIP) is to encourage safe and responsible riding habits by partially underwriting continuing motorcycle skill education courses taken by members of the MONTANA BMW RIDERS Motorcycle Club. If you were a member (dues paid) on and since April 1, 2024, then you are eligible for reimbursement of up to \$50 for the cost of the course you took. The training must be intended to improve your riding skills for either on or off-road riding. Only one course per year can be reimbursed. The SCIP is administered by Kevin Huddy (huddykl@gmail.com;).

Courses offered by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation, Lee Parks Total Control, RowHyde Adventures, or course offered by the BMW Motorrad Performance Center are approved. Track days are not generally eligible. If you have a course, you think may be eligible, then contact Kevin. Qualified club members will be reimbursed up to \$50.

If more than eight members qualify, then the available funds will be divided equally among the applicants.

Requests for reimbursement can be made after the completion of an approved safety course but must be received prior to October 1, 2024. Payments will be made by the club Treasurer in October once all applications are received. Submit request for reimbursement to Kevin (<u>huddykl@gmail.com</u>;). Request must include proof of successful completion of the course. Proof can be in the form of a legible copy, scan, or photograph of the original document.

Gravelly Range Ride - by the participants

The **Gravelly Range** in Montana, with its highest peak, **Black Butte** (elevation 10,542 feet), holds geographical importance. Covering about **310,000 acres**, it's largely roadless and divided into nine units. The range lies within the **Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest**. Notably, the northern part includes the **Axolotl Lakes Wilderness Study Area**. The Gravellies feature diverse landscapes: open foothills, mixed coniferous forests, meadows, and rugged areas with deep canyons and cliffs. It hosts **high-elevation pronghorn habitat** and nesting sites for **trumpeter swans** and **bald eagles**. The Gravelly Range boasts the largest expanse of undisturbed natural prairie in Montana.

Although not travelled often by MONTANA BMW RIDERS, essentially the area that encompasses the tracks shown on the adjacent map, those who have ridden there consider it one of the best off-road adventures in Montana.

Mike Kreikemeier, Jay Cowan and Lance Lerum organized a ride in the area for the 2024 riding season. Base camp at Cottonwood camp ground, the approximate center of the tracks on the adjacent map, about 20 members spent three days exploring the area. I have tried to capture the story of this adventure in the photos by the riders, and the numerous emails transmitted during the planning stage. Hopefully, they tell the story.

"Yesterday, 7/6/24, Lance and I did a quick scouting ride in the Gravellies . We trailered small bikes to Lyon bridge and rode Westish up Standard creek past Black Butte to the Gravelly ridge then down Cottonwood rode to the Cottonwood Campground. We had lunch then rode Northish along the Ruby creek then up Warmsprings road to the Gravelly road then down Johnny ridge road past the talc mine to Mcatee bridge then back down the highway to the car."

"Attached are a couple pictures from the upper few miles of Cottonwood road showing ruts and one of the mud puddles . This section of road is not advised for inexperienced dirt riders or any one if it rains very much."

"I am planning to bring a 20 ft enclosed car hauler trailer with 110 gallons of good potable water in food quality plastic barrels. A full size fridge. A freezer with ice. Lots of cold beer and some pop. The trailer can be used as storage for food to stay bear safe. If anyone is arriving the 17th I will bring the trailer then. I can plant the keys somewhere. I need to be back in Belgrade for the night of the 17th. If no one will be there the 17th I might wait and bring the trailer and my GS on the morning of the 18th. I might have to make 2 trips anyways since I am planning to bring a friend and a camper at some point."

"Only a bit over a week to go until the Ride. We have several of you that will be hauling bikes down and have offered to bring along items for folks riding in. And don't forget, our club monthly lunch will be that Sunday in Ennis at the park at the east end of the main drag which will give us a good chance to count heads and make sure everyone made it out of the woods."

"The nearest gas stations to the campground are at Virginia City, Sheridan, and Ennis (39, 42, and 52 miles respectively). For those of you riding in, try to arrange with one of the folks hauling their bikes to bring along your extra fuel, coolers, rehydrating liquids, camp chairs, bug dope, and any other items you may agree on. Mike K has us all set for water, ice, fridges, freezers, and some liquid refreshments. I also will bring along firewood, unless with this heat, we end up with fire restrictions."

"The nearest gas stations to the campground are at Virginia City, Sheridan, and Ennis (39, 42, and 52 miles respectively)." "For those of you riding in, try to arrange with one of the folks hauling their bikes to bring along your extra fuel, coolers, rehydrating liquids, camp chairs, bug dope, and any other items you may agree on. Mike K has us all set for water, ice, fridges, freezers, and some liquid refreshments. I will be trailering from Townsend and will bring along 10-12 extra gallons of the good stuff for bikes

"The plan was to have no plan for food and everyone fend for themselves. However, I recently sent a steer to freezer camp and will bring along enough hamburger and fixings for everyone for Friday night. Nate has volunteered to bring his propane grill so we should be able to get them cooked even if we can't build a fire. Jay also has a big wok that can cook up lots of things if we can have a fire, and had some breakfast ideas that involved tortillas. Do plan to bring your oatmeal, bagels, nuts and twigs or whatever for your breakfast and lunches though. For Saturday night, the nearest restaurant is in Alder at Chicks Bar (30 miles of good road). so best if you plan to bring brats or something to throw on Nate's grill. Rich mentioned the possibility of bringing along a deep fryer and catfish if he gets his lines set and has any luck."

"I suspect that those that require a shot of coffee to get going in the morning will bring along their fancy jet boils and gourmet blends and fix their own."

One other note before the ride:

"Last Saturday Jay and I had no cell coverage at the campground or along the four access routes we traveled up to the Ridge Road."

"I have ridden with several of you in the past, and for you, I know I am about to state the obvious and I hate being the guy who does that. There are others in this Gravely group that I have not met or maybe ridden with and I do look forward to that opportunity. When riding in a group, and we will most certainly be splitting into smaller groups for each day's ride, there is a certain responsibility all members of a group should share so that all get back to camp safely. Recently on a ride to Oregon I had assumed (major fault of mine) that everyone knew these rules, but that wasn't the case and I don't want to make that mistake again, hence the following:

- Find a group of likeminded and/or similar capabilities and objectives riders that you will ride with on the routes you desire. Small groups are much easier to manage and give more freedom than large groups (and less dust). Of course solo always gives the most freedom, but I recall Phil saying that at least three were optimal; one to stay with a down rider and one to ride for help.
- Individuals in a group will likely spread out when riding because of dust, so each rider is responsible for tracking that the rider immediately following is still back there. Keep watch in your mirrors and if you haven't seen the following rider for a minute or two, maybe because of dust, twisty roads and sight distances, stopping for photo ops, pumping the bilge, whatever, slow down or stop until you make contact again.
- If you are lagging and haven't seen the rider in front in awhile maybe pick up your pace a bit, if you safely can, until you are in view again.
- Ride with your lights on (so much easier to see a following rider through your dust).
- At junctions, wait until you are sure your following rider sees which way you are going. That rider then waits until the next rider sees the route and so on (this is what didn't happen and how we got separated on the Little Belt Ride).
- It is very scenic up there so folks will want to stop and take photos slowing down the group. I even take pictures of flowers! If you are leading, stop often, be patient, and enjoy the cooler temperatures up there. The days are long and distances are short. No prizes for who finishes first or does the most miles.
- 'Ride your own Bike!' That is, don't feel compelled to unsafely keep up or ride beyond your or your bike's capabilities. Ultimately you are responsible for riding safely. My mantra is to always blame my tires for being slow.

'Pretty simple really... The point is to stay on track and to be close by to timely render aid if a rider should breakdown or go down and need help. And let's not leave anyone in the woods."
