

### President's Corner - Larry Manchester



The last month and a half have been wild. August 16<sup>th</sup> I was in a left turn lane on the north side of Hamilton waiting for traffic to clear so I could turn left and head back home to Corvallis. I was in my truck. As I left my house earlier to run a couple of errands, I almost climbed on my bike but decided at the last minute to take my truck, a decision that probably saved my life. As I sat there, I noticed a car in the turn lane ahead coming in my direction, then I noticed the car was coming very fast and was passing the cars in the two northbound lanes. When it entered the intersection, I knew I was going to be hit. I had nowhere to go, traffic in all lanes around me. At the last second, I jerked the wheel hard left and moved about 5ft, which was all I could move, or get broadsided by the Northbound traffic. That was just enough to avoid a total head on collision. Police estimated the car that hit me was going 55MPH. Police cited the driver and deemed him 100% at fault. Thankfully, I was not injured, just sore for a few

days. My truck, a Ram 1500 Crew cab was totaled. Weeks of fighting with the drivers' Insurance company has left me totally fed up with Insurance companies, but we finally settled, and I found a used Ram 1500 to replace mine.

Then last week I took my Super Tenere into a local bike shop to get a new front tire. Picked the bike up the next day and took a short ride to Stevensville and then back home, thirty miles total. Parked the bike in the garage with a full tank of gas ready for the ride to the Club meeting last Sunday in Wilsall. Sunday at 7:30 AM I climbed on the bike, looking forward to the ride and the meeting. I only made it a half mile and only going 30 MPH when I noticed a funny sound coming from the front wheel. I started to slow down and quickly noticed I had no front brake. Using the rear brake, I stopped at a pullout to check the front wheel. The left Caliper and rotor looked fine, moved to the right side, and noticed a bolt missing from the Caliper, and one bolt very loose. Touched the Caliper and it fell off, just hanging from the brake line. Had that happened while going down the highway at speed it could have been very bad. Limped the bike home and dropped it by the shop the next day. When I walked up to the counter and laid the one remaining bolt on the glass the owner of the shop looked at me and said, "Oh my God, he didn't tighten the bolts." "He" being the young mechanic working at the shop. The owner was beyond embarrassed, he knew I could have been severely injured or worse. To his credit he made it right, checked the Caliper and Rotor. Replaced all the bolts and even replaced a missing reflector and bracket that were missing when I bought the bike. We both learned a lesson that day. He will be checking the work of his young mechanic before it leaves his shop, and I will be looking very closely for loose or missing bolts or parts before every ride.

They say bad things come in groups of threes. If this is true, I still have one bad thing to deal with. That makes me nervous. I was going to go up this week and cut a load of firewood at my favorite spot in the Mountains. I am not sure I want to operate a chainsaw right now. That can wait. And I will be doubly cautious at all intersections, and I will be riding and driving a little slower than normal for a while.

Hope to see many of you at Trixis in Ovando next month. Ride safe friends and enjoy all the fall colors. It is a great time to live in Montana.

Remember there are three winners: 1) the individual with the most accumulated miles during the contest season (April 1 to October 31); 2) an average mileage winner...that person who's accumulated miles is the closest to the average mileage accumulate by all participants; and 3) after eliminating the first two names, a third name is drawn from the hat as the "at large" winner. Overall, the winner gets a check of \$75 from the club and his/her name placed on our mileage plaque (value priceless!), the "average mileage winner" and "at large" winner each get a check for \$50 from the club.

I will include another reminder in the October newsletter, but when it comes out, you will only have 2 weeks to get your ending mileage turned it to me. By putting this in the September newsletter, you will have some time to get your last rides in and your mileage recorded.



### Monthly Club Meeting - Bank Bar & Vault Restaurant - Wilsall, Montana

Ironically, **Dan Astin**, published the following piece in the <u>Livingston Enterprise</u> about the Bank Bar & Vault Restaurant. Editor

WILSALL — The Bank Bar and Vault Restaurant, an iconic Wilsall eatery, could gain more fans from afar after a crew with "America's Best Restaurants," a national vlog production, media and marketing company, visited the establishment on Sept. 11.

The second-generation, family-owned restaurant is the only bar in Wilsall, a Park County town with roughly 200 residents. The place is undoubtedly unique, and was anonymously nominated online to be featured in the show.

Patrons get small-town service with a smile, drink beer chilled in an early 1900s bank vault turned walk-in cooler, eat 100% locally sourced grass-fed beef, and can gander at a stuffed two-headed, six-legged calf, also locally sourced.

"They've filmed most of the day," David Shockey said.

Shockey owns the restaurant, formerly the Farmers State Bank, which operated as early as 1912, with his wife, Karen Shockey.

The couple run the establishment with their daughter, Ashley Mugnier, a dozen employees and a little help from their young grandchildren.

The Shockeys, who also own the Muddy Creek Ranch, a Wilsall commercial cattle operation, explained they took over the establishment around 2017, after the passing of Bob and Edie Tomasko, Karen Shockey's parents.

The Tomaskos originally opened the restaurant in 2007 showcasing beef from the family ranch, where the restaurant's supply originates. The Muddy Creek Ranch runs 200 head of cattle, shows and sells them across the U.S.

"Not many folks do what we do," said Shockey. "We're ranch-to-table. That's what we do every day. We're proud of our menu and what we've put together. People drive for two to three hours to come to our restaurant."

The proprietor took a moment and mused at a taxidermy bicephalic hexapod calf. The deceased two-headed, six-legged animal was born in 2011 on the family ranch and is on display in a glass case, on a shelf above the bar-back. The wooden bar-back is emblazoned with local cattle brands.

"It has that small-town feel. The food is great and the people are even better," said J Russell, the show's host and public relations coordinator for the vlog show.

Russell, originally from Phoenix, Arizona, said the Wilsall stop was his fifth Montana restaurant visit. The Bank Bar and Vault Restaurant is one of roughly 1,700 joints the show visited in the U.S. The America's Best Restaurants crew visits roughly 800 eateries annually.

"It is all about the business," said Russell, who exuded energy and enthusiasm testing food, tasting drinks and presenting the bar's western ambiance for the camera. Russell recorded numerous takes at the restaurant for three hours with his two-person crew, for a 10-15 minute YouTube video.


After 7-8 weeks post-production, the vlog episode is slated to air on The Bank Bar and Vault Restaurant Facebook page before it is uploaded to the "America's Best Restaurants" YouTube channel, website, and other social media.



### Places to Visit - St. Ignatius Mission - St. Ignatius, Montana












UPPER MISSOURI BREAKS NATIONAL MOUNMENT - Phil Haglund


















### Reports from the Road - John DiBari

Some motorcycles were a matter of necessity (finances), some for convenience, some for practicality, but all were for passion. As I dig through the boxes of photos and notes of my past, I have accumulated a few showing a few of my two-wheelers over the years. The following page are a few of the photos, and some of the circumstances, that put me on two wheels in my early adulthood.

Historian's Rear View Mirror - Kim Lemke - (continued)



West of Denver, Colorado at one of the tunnels of the Million Dollar Highway in 1970. The bike was a 1968-69 Yamaha 350 Grand Prix with a 350cc two-stroke motor. I purchased the Wixom Fairing (fairing/windscreen) and the Craven Panniers from a friend. My father made the brackets to mount the panniers. Wixom Fairing and Craven (imported from England) and fiberglass panniers. Very expensive I might add.

It was loaded with a double sleeping bag, Colman stove plus all of the other gear needed to ride from Minnesota to San Francisco. The photographer, who shot the photo with Kodak Instamatic and 126 film, rode with me. The print was 2 inches by 2 inches.





This Yamaha 350 cc two-cycle, eventually modified as shown in the photo on the left. It was my daily 'driver' taking into consideration I was living in Minnesota. .

In addition to the trip to Salt Lake City and then to San Francisco describe in the column on the left, in 1969 I rode this one from Canada to Iowa and Wisconsin from Minneapolis.

In 1970 this bike took me from Minnesota to Atlantic City, New Jersey and then on to San Francisco via Denver, Colorado.

In 1971 it was my mode of transportations from Minnesota to Southern Illinois and back.

In 1972 I rode it from Minneapolis to Carbondale, Illinois to Indianapolis Motor Speedway where I saw the best 1971 road racers including Gene Romero. From there, it got me back to Carbondale.

In April, 1973 I sold it to finance a trip to Fairbanks, Alaska by boat.

After college, I took a job in Education in Australia. Confronted with equal doses of passion and necessity when I arrived in Sydney NSW Australia in February 1975, I purchased a 1973 BMW R75LWB. This was the bike I rode all over Australia, except Northern Territories and Tasmania. I sold it August 1976 when I left Australia.

By 1992 I had started to upgrade my 'protective' riding gear—note the leather pants - however cowboy boots seemed right at the time. The photo was near Camp David, Maryland on a 1972 BMW R60/5 "Toaster", nicknamed such for the chromed covering on the gas tank. This bike was built for me from a box of parts by **John Beyrau**. I eventually sold it while in Baltimore, Maryland. My 1977 BMW R75/7 is still in my stable. I had a 1981 R80 GS that we took to the Alps in Switzerland in 1985, and it now resides with **John Beyrau** in Helena. My 1988 BMW K100 is still with me and quite active.

### Reports from the Road - Mike Hofferber

September 11 **Pete DeGroat** and I, trailered my Suzuki DR650 and Pete's Yamaha Tenere 700 on a 1,700 mile round trip to Vernon, BC (photo on the right) for the 7<sup>th</sup> annual The Adventure Bike Gathering. A very loosely organized event put on by some locals as an informal event, but with a great deal of organization. The two men, who were generally recognized as the directors of the event, wore pink tutus (see photo below) so they can be spotted in the crowd. Roughly 200 attended this year.

Pete and I stayed in a campground, using the enclosed trailer for sleeping.




On the final day, we selected a route with a water crossing. Of the 14 in the group, only two made it without help. Neither Pete nor I were among the two.



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
