It looked like a brisk but snow free 205 mile ride.





#### JIB MILL

The Hope. Katy and White Elephant mines behind this sign were once part of the most productive mining enterprises in the history of the Basin. The Hope and Katy lodes produced \$5.000.000 of ore between 1890 and 1910. On April 20, 1895, the BASIN TIMES told of a particularly good strike that was made that spring.

The Hope mine has long been noted for the richness of it's ores, but now it is noted for the quantity of solid gold. Upon the discovery of la drift of exceptionally rich ore! Foreman Buckley summoned Manager Fletcher to the scene at once and in the first piece that he picked up was contained over \$500 of pure gold. The surroundings fairly dazzled his eyes.

The Jib Mill was built in 1900 to efficiently process the ore. At one time more than 100 men were employed at the mill. The structure burned down in 1975.



Basin, a boom and bust mining town with gold being reported as early as 1862, hit its stride between 1890's and 1920's. It was served by two railroads, between Butte and Helena. What is now main street, was U. S. Highway 91 starting in California and ending at the Canadian border near Sweet Grass, Montana.

A short lived revival occurred when exposure to radiation from Radon was considered beneficial to relieving various ailments.

The Merry Widow mine played hoists to visitors for that purpose.

After Interstate Highway 15 was completed in the 1990's, by-passing Basin it gradually retreated in prosperity. Between 1993 and 2011 it was home to the Montana Artist Refuge. For nearly two decades Basin became home to nationally significant artists, who converted many of the mining day buildings to studios and galleries. The art scene was noted for its informality, with guests simply popping in to an artist's studio to observe and converse with the artists.

Nothing seems to be written on why the community disbanded even though the quite and serene atmosphere would seem to be a match for artists with a desire for the solitude to pursue their passion.

The \$5,000,000 of gold at today's prices would be close to \$650,000,000.

I was not able to locate any of the history of the Silver Saddle Bar and Café. According to the Montana State Library cadastral maps, it was constructed in 1885 and from a photo in the café, it appeared to have been a merchandise store and perhaps a barber shop at one time. The building has aged well, and the café has a reputation for good food in the atmosphere of an old and almost forgotten mining town. Editor

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
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
